The four standing forms placed in the pool of the fountain were made by sculptress Lizanne Kempsell. The commission was brought about through the Dundee Public Art Programme during the refurbishment works in 1987 of City Square.

Each of the standing forms takes on a poem that links to one of the classical elements of Fire, Air Water, and Earth.

Lizanne specialised in animal sculpture, particularly horses which uses to illustrate the poems.
