

CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982
INDOOR SPORTS LICENCE
CONDITIONS IN RELATION TO PREMISES

1. The use of the premises is restricted to the following kind or kinds of entertainment or recreation viz:-
2. The number of persons admitted to the premises at any one time shall not exceed:-
3. The premises may be open for the purposes of recreation or entertainment only as follows:-
4. The licence holder shall comply with any order or instruction given by any constable for the prevention of annoyance to the public or to the occupiers of any premises or in connection with any emergency or disturbance (including an order or instruction to close the premises for a limited period) or on any occasion when such constable in his discretion may consider it necessary in the public interest to give such order or instruction.
5. The licence holder shall not in any way alter, erase or deface his licence.
6. The licence holder shall comply with or ensure compliance with such recommendations as may be made by Tayside Fire and Rescue and the City Council's technical officers.
7. The licence holder shall ensure that he has sufficient staff to supervise the running of the entertainment and compliance with the requirements of the City Council's technical officers.
8. No more than chairbound persons each accompanied by two able bodied persons shall be admitted to the premises at any one time.
9. The licence holder shall ensure that to the satisfaction of the Environmental and Consumer Protection Department:
 - (a) suitable and sufficient sanitary accommodation shall be provided;
 - (b) all parts of the premises and all fittings therein shall be kept clean;
 - (c) suitable and sufficient means of heating and ventilating the premises shall be provided; and
 - (d) such measures as may be necessary are taken to prevent noise nuisance to residents and occupiers of premises in the vicinity.
10. The licence holder shall ensure that -
 - (a) all exit routes are kept free from obstruction and that exit doors are not locked or fastened to prevent them being easily and immediately opened by persons leaving the premises; and
 - (b) all equipment installed as a precaution against fire shall be maintained in efficient working order.
11. The licence holder, or some responsible person (not under 21 years of age) nominated for the purpose by him shall be present and in charge during the whole period of time that the public are on the premises.
12. The holder of an Indoor Sports Licence must be over the age of 21 years.
