1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report advises members that 2018 is the Year of Young People (YOYP) and provides details of the approach being taken to co-ordinate activities across the city.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

4.0 MAIN TEXT

- 4.1 As part of the Scottish Government's programme of themed years, 2018 has been identified as the Year of Young People. The aims are to inspire Scotland through its young people, celebrate their achievements, value their contribution to communities and create new opportunities for them to shine locally, nationally and globally. The Year has 6 key themes on Participation; Equality and Discrimination; Education; Health and Wellbeing; Culture; and Enterprise and Regeneration. This is an exciting opportunity to co-produce an innovative and dynamic calendar of projects, activities and events to celebrate and showcase young people in Dundee. Recognition of the achievements of our youth are not new to the city. These celebratory events will compliment other existing annual events such as the Lord Provost McManus Award for Citizenship that as well as celebrating citizenship across our schools selects a young citizen of the year for the City.
- 4.2 In the build up to the year, in 2015-16 an in-depth engagement process was undertaken with young people across Scotland, including Dundee. Based on what was heard through this engagement process, young people themselves made recommendations on aims, objectives and priority themes. All activity delivered through the Year of Young People 2018 should be developed with a clear focus on meeting these aims and objectives. The objectives are as follows:
 - Provide a platform for young people to have their views heard and acted upon
 - Showcase the amazing talents of young people through events and media
 - Develop better understanding, co-operation and respect between generations
 - Recognise the impact of teachers, youth workers and other supporting adults on young people's lives
 - Provide opportunities for young people to express themselves through culture, sport and other activities

- 4.4 In Dundee, our shared partnership vision is that "our children and young people have the best start in life and Dundee is the best place in Scotland to grow up". Partners have always recognised that young people are one of our greatest assets. This is evident though the existence of a number of forums, such as School Pupil Councils, City Wide Pupil Councils, Young Peoples Sports Panel, Young Ambassadors, Sports Committees and the Champions Board. These forums allow young people to have their views heard, showcase their talent and co-produce work.
- 4.5 The Year of Young People provides an opportunity to build on these arrangements and to help maximise opportunities, a short-life working group was established to develop a local plan. This group is chaired by the Executive Director of Children and Families and representatives from Neighbourhood Services CLD Youth Work, Corporate Services Discover Work Service, Leisure and Culture Dundee, Dundee Youth Council and the Third Sector are actively involved.
- 4.6 A plan is being developed to outline key events scheduled for this year. It should be recognised, however, that the plan is only a snapshot in time and will evolve as the year progresses. Events will provide partners with an opportunity to discuss with young people what we currently offer and consider what we should be offering in the future. It is a chance to provide universal opportunities for all our young people as well as providing targeted events for our young people most in need. It is anticipated that many of the events will continue beyond 2018. A summary of activities is included in Appendix 1.
- 4.7 The plan will be launched at a suitable event to be sure to capture the attention of a wide audience.

5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Maggie's Penguin Parade - Education Programme	Maggie's Penguin Parade has been purposefully designed to include a learning programme which will enable thousands of young people to experience the importance of creativity both within school and also the wider community as part of the main event. 	Thanks to the support of Northwood Trust and the local Community Regeneration Forums - Maggie's have been able to ensure the education program will be delivered in every nursery, primary and secondary school in in Dundee - as well as the Offsite Education Service, Young Persons Residential Units, Additional Support Needs schools and 30 community and youth groups - allowing necessary education through the arts. It is a fantastic opportunity for schools to engage pupils, carers, parents and teachers in whole school, whole-community conversations around a series of topics, including the difficult subject of cancer.		
	Participating schools and groups will receive a 4ft penguin which will be decorated by students and teachers in Term 3 and 4 of 2018. An accompanying cross- curricular education resource will enable schools to use the interest generated by the Penguin Parade to encourage a creative, inclusive and engaging learning experience – supplemented for each primary school by a trip to meet the Humbolt penguins at St Andrew's Aquarium.		
	During July-September 2018, the baby penguins will be publicly exhibited in local clusters for the duration of the event. They will complement and add real value to the main Penguin Parade trail by showcasing the creativity of Dundee's youngest citizens. After the event the penguins will be returned to their respective schools to be retained as mementos.
