## 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To submit to the Committee a request for renewal of revenue funding to Dundee Repertory Theatre Main House, 2006-2007.

#### 2.0 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the Committee approves the level of grant funding amounting to £346,275 as set out in the Report.

#### 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The funding recommended is £346,275, which sum is provided for in the Department's Revenue Budget for 2006-2007, as shown in the Budget at Appendix 1.
- 3.2 The terms and conditions of grant will be contained within a Funding Agreement 2006-2007, between Dundee City Council and Dundee Repertory Theatre Main House.

#### 4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The renewal of revenue funding to Dundee Repertory Theatre Main House will ensure the continued provision of a popular cultural service, that local needs are met locally, and that opportunities for culture, leisure and recreation are readily available to all.

## 5.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The mission statement of Dundee Repertory Theatre is to provide the highest possible arts service to Dundee and to be central to the cultural life of Dundee by investing in opportunities for those communities who may not normally benefit from mainstream arts provision. The building provides full disabled access to all public areas. Access is further facilitated by the operation of a range of discount and concessionary ticket offers.
- 5.2 The Funding Agreement 2006-2007 will contain requirements that Dundee Repertory Theatre Main House practises equal opportunities policies in respect of its dealings with its public and staff.

## 6.0 MAIN TEXT

6.1 In 2005-2006 Dundee Rep continued to build its audience and reputation both with local audiences and further afield. The company produced a number of sell out

shows and received critical acclaim in both local and national press.

## 6.2 **Highlights of the Year:**

- A stage version of the award winning film The Graduate adapted by Terry Johnston, which played to 82% capacity audiences and gained good reviews.
- A co-production with leading touring company Paines Plough on a new play by Douglas Maxwell which toured to the Menier Chocolate Factory in London.
- The professional premiere of Ubu the King by Jarry adapted by leading Scottish writer David Greig. This was also a co-production with the Tron Theatre and The Barbican Theatre in London as part of a season of work entitled Young Genius. This production sold out its London performances and gave the Dundee Rep name a high profile in a national context.
- In autumn 2005 the company produced Gypsy, a large scale musical, involving a cast of 12 professional actors, 7 musicians, 5 students from Dundee's Dance and Drama Course and Dundee College and a team of 18 local children. This production was a sell out success and received good critical acclaim. The local audience reaction was excellent.
- The company's Christmas show Cinderella played to 92% capacity.
- In the early part of 2006 the company are producing a small scale production of Dr Korczak's Example, also by David Greig, which will tour to the Yokohama International Theatre Festival and to the Aster Plaza Theatre in Hiroshima. This production will return from Japan to carry out a tour of local schools, continuing to build relationships with local schools and to provide an educational resource within the city.
- The company continues to develop work aimed at children, young people and their families, with a number of visiting company performances. The audiences for this strand of work are continuing to grow.
- Dundee Rep continues to programme a year-round season of dance, including visits from companies new to Dundee such as Iceland Dance and Galili Dance from the Netherlands.
- The company continues to support young actors by employing two new apprentice actors who will be with the company for a year to continue their training.
- The role of Education within the theatre continues to develop with attendances at productions by school parties continuing to grow and the number of workshops provided for schools increasing.

#### 6.3 Plans for 2006-2007:

- For the first time Scottish Dance Theatre and the Dundee Rep Ensemble will combine forces to produce a large scale family show based on the Chinese Monkey legends and made famous through the cult 1970's television series. This production will also tour to the International Children's Theatre Festival in Edinburgh and to Glasgow and Aberdeen.
- The company will continue to programme a variety of visiting companies providing dance, drama, comedy, music and work for young people.
- The company will continue to support training apprenticeships for young actors.
- Dundee Rep also aims to develop its role as a creative learning centre, allowing opportunities for learning across all aspects of its operation.
- 6.4 Attendances to date in 2005-2006 are 69,233. The theatre continues to be a substantial factor in the local economy and sustains 70 full-time equivalent jobs.
