### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report seeks to inform the Education Committee of the capital allocation from The Early Years, Childcare & Play Capital Fund which was established by the Scottish Government for 2007-08. It seeks approval from the Education Committee to allocate this funding to support projects in the Voluntary sector.

#### 2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 The Education Committee is requested to approve the projects recommended by the Director of Education pertaining to the allocation of funding of £44,000 to the Voluntary Sector. Approval is also sought for the purchase of equipment totalling £15,000 to create a Resource Library of quality play materials and equipment for the use of Voluntary sector groups.

## 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The proposed expenditure is £59,000 of revenue in respect of the projects identified in Appendices 1 and 2, which will be met from the Early Years, Childcare and Play Capital Fund 2007-08.

## 4.0 MAIN TEXT

- 4.1 This proposal, which reflects guidelines laid down by the Scottish Government, will enhance the quality of play experiences and offer choice and diversity in early years and childcare provision. It will also improve links with parents and strengthen partnerships with the Voluntary sector.
- 4.2 The Scottish Government announced a new Early Years, Childcare & Play Capital Fund for the current financial year, from which the specific allocation to Dundee City Council was £221,000. Ministers had set a target of at least 20% of this funding to be used in the voluntary & community sectors.
- 4.3 Reference is made to Article V of the meeting of this Committee of 27 August 2007 which outlined an allocation of £44,000 to the voluntary sector and identified an additional funding of £15,000 for the creation of a Voluntary sector Resource Library.

- 4.4 The Scottish Government set five priorities for the use of this funding, as follows:
  - (i) Refurbishing or upgrading Early Years facilities to create a better environment for staff and children and to develop closer links with parents.
  - (ii) Creating, extending or refurbishing Early Years facilities to deliver more integrated service working.
  - (iii) Improving facilities for Out of School care.
  - (iv) Creating, refurbishing or upgrading play spaces, equipment and facilities for children, both within Early Years centres and in the wider community.
  - (v) Adapting and purchasing equipment to improve access to play for children with Additional Support Needs in Early Years and Out of School care centres.

## **Proposed allocation to Voluntary Sector**

- 4.5 An independent panel of representatives from across the Voluntary sector were brought together to review bids received and were instrumental in agreeing the recommendations outlined in Appendix 1. The proposed expenditure identifies the various projects to be funded from this allocation (see Appendix 1)
- 4.6 Items outlined in Appendix 1 will enable a range of voluntary providers and community groups to access funding to improve their provision. It will also enable Voluntary section and community groups to identify capital work that will enhance services they offer.
- 4.7 The Childcare Development Officer for the voluntary sector will support all relevant groups and will monitor the development of services and benefits derived from this funding.

#### **Voluntary Sector Resource Library**

- 4.8 An independent steering group was formed to agree the range of equipment and resources most appropriate for a Resource Library. Appendix 2 identifies suppliers of quality resources and equipment. These resources can be borrowed from the Resource Library by Voluntary sector groups.
- 4.9 The Resource Library will enable voluntary organisations, local Toddler groups, Playgroups, and Out of School Clubs to access play equipment which will improve the provision of outdoor and indoor physical play.
- 4.10 The Childcare Development Officer who supports voluntary sector groups will chair a small steering group to monitor the development, implementation and organisation of the Resource Library.

## 5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 This Report has been screened for any policy implications in respect of Sustainability, Strategic Environmental Assessment, Anti- Poverty, Equality of Impact Assessment and Risk Management.
- 5.2 There are no major issues.

## 6.0 CONSULTATION
