1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This Report considers the need to stop up footpaths at Whitfield Drive/Whitfield Square in order to allow the construction of new housing.

2 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 The Committee is asked to approve the preparation of the necessary Roads Order to stop-up footpaths in the Whitfield Drive/Whitfield Square area. The Committee is also asked, subject to no objections to the Order being received or all objections received being withdrawn, to authorise the formal confirmation of the Order.

- 6.1 Planning consent has been granted for the construction of houses on what is currently an open area at Whitfield Drive/Whitfield Square and over which are interconnecting footpaths.
- 6.2 The footpath network connects the existing housing at Whitfield Square with Whitfield Drive and the subway under Whitfield Drive.
- 6.3 As part of the new development new roads and footpaths will be provided and the connection to the subway will be maintained.
- 6.4 The attached plan shows the footpaths which will be required to be stopped up and the new roads and footpaths to be provided.

7 CONSULTATIONS

7.1 The Chief Executive, Director of Finance, Director of Support Services, Director of Corporate Planning, Director of Housing, Legal Manager and the Chief Constable have been consulted and are in agreement with the contents of this report.
