1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to obtain approval for entering into a further agreement with an external company to provide a phone service for the collection of Council Tax by way of credit/debit card.

2.0 RECOMMENDATION

That the Director of Finance is authorised to enter into a contract with MGT Ltd to operate a payment by phone service from now until 31 March 2002.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The cost in any financial year will depend on the take-up level of service but is expected to be in the order of £25,000 per annum.
- 3.2 Provision for this expenditure has been included within the Finance Department's 2001/2002 Revenue Budget.

4.0 AGENDA 21

4.1 The continuation of electronic/telephone payment systems will continue to reduce the amount of paper being used and fuel consumption as a result of a reduction in miles travelled to payment offices.

5.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

Payment by telephone allows easier access to payment facility for persons who have difficulty travelling.

6.0 BACKGROUND

- The Finance Committee at its meeting on 12 June 2000 considered Report No 381/2000 and approved a continuation of the scheme whereby MGT Ltd provide for a period of one year a payment by phone service for Council Tax.
- During last year the number of payments received was approximately 10,000 and the total Council Tax collected amounted to some £1,150,000.
- 6.3 The cost of the scheme amounted to approximately £25,000.
- The Council is presently unable to provide a similar service from within its own staffing resources.
- The Council is presently investigating the possibility of extending the payment by credit/debit cards to other Council debts.
