1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report considers the necessity to stop-up and remove from the List of Public Roads lengths of carriageway, footway and parking area in the Foggyley area utilising the powers of the Town & Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 to accommodate a new housing development following planning consent.

1.2 This report also considers the necessity to convert sections of carriageway to footway to provide new footways, or realign existing footways in the Foggyley area utilising the powers of the Town & Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 to accommodate a new housing development following planning consent.

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee approve the proposed stopping-up order as detailed below.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The costs of preparing the Order will be met by the developer.

4 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Following planning approval to construct housing on the aforementioned areas it will be necessary to stop-up and remove from the List of Public Roads and convert various lengths of roads and footways which will be constructed over as part of the new development. The lengths depicted on the available plan will require to be stopped up, or converted to footway. The footpaths and roads will be realigned or replaced as part of the development.

- 4.3 The length of carriageway, footpaths, or footways which are depicted on the attached plan will require to be stopped-up and removed from the List of Public Roads or converted to carriageway.
