1.1 The Communities Committee is asked to note the approval of European Social Fund monies for the delivery of Adult Guidance and Learning, for the period March 2005 – April 2006.

- 6.1 In December 2004 the Learning Around, Adult Guidance and Learning project was approved at Policy and Resources Committee, 20 December 2004. The project, funded from the Community Regeneration Fund aims to provide impartial adult guidance to help support the most excluded to take up learning, employment and community involvement opportunities. This funding has been used as a match to secure European Social Fund monies.
- This funding will allow the project to continue to operate across a wide geographical area, which includes all ESF eligible postcode areas in Dundee

7.1 The Chief Executive, Assistant Chief Executive (Community Planning), Assistant Chief Executive (Management), and the Depute Chief Executives (Finance) and (Support Services) have been consulted in the preparation of this report, which is based on recommendations made by the Literacies Sub-Group of the Community Learning Partnership.
