# 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To authorise the purchase of the annual quantity of replacement wheeled bins and euro containers which are estimated to be required during 2020/21.

## 2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 It is recommended that approval be given to purchase the bins and containers required through the Scotland Excel framework.

## 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The Executive Director of Corporate Services advises that the costs of £272,000 can be met from allowances for Recycling and Waste Management in 2020/21 that are included within the Service Provision section of the General Services Capital Plan 2020/25.

#### 4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Neighbourhood Services provides a domestic and commercial waste collection and recycling service to approximately 76,000 properties and 1,300 commercial customers within the city. New or replacement containers require to be issued:
  - for new build properties;
  - to new commercial customers;
  - for householders and commercial customers who wish to participate in recycling schemes; and
  - where containers have been damaged.

Where possible, refurbished containers will be provided, however new containers require to be added to the Council's stock to meet demands.

- 4.2 All containers will be supplied via a pre-tendered framework from Scotland Excel 01-17 Refuse and Recycling Containers.
- 4.3 Direct delivery is made by suppliers to the Marchbanks Depot.
