1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report seeks approval to award a grant(s) for the delivery of employability services following an evaluation of the bids received by the Dundee Partnership Employability Assessment Group.

2 **RECOMMENDATION**

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee approves the award of a grant of £244,676 to the Wise Group to deliver employability services grant from 1 June 2016 to 31 March 2017.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The award of the grant of £244,676 will be met by the City Development Department Employability Budget for 2016/17.

4 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Reference is made to Article V of the meeting of the City Development Department on 7 December 2015 which approved extensions to existing employability contracts and agreed an open competition to award grants to organisations to deliver additional employability services. In March, one of the procured contracts was extended (Craigowl Communities money and debt advice). Advertisements were made in the local press and on the Dundee City Council website to alert organisations to the opportunity to bid for grant funds of up to £250,000 for employability pipeline support for Stage 3 employability training, work placements and job outcomes. Correspondence was also sent directly to 63 external past, present and potential organisations, predominantly in the Third Sector and to the Third Sector Interface to highlight the opportunity.
- 4.2 The advert was non-prescriptive and invited proposals that were innovative and closely aligned to the emerging recommendations of the Review of Employability Services in Dundee, undertaken by consultants Rocket Science.
- 4.3 Ten proposals were received and went through the evaluation process, using the Evaluation and Scoring Framework. The Assessment Group comprises members of the Dundee Partnership: Dundee City Council, Department of Work and Pensions, Skills Development Scotland and the Third Sector Interface. The Assessment Group met on 9th May to agree the final scores and ranking of the proposals received. These were scored using a framework to assess a number of criteria including quality, outputs and targets and value for money and alignment with the recommendations of the. Review of Employability
- 4.4 The results of the scoring and evaluation process and therefore recommendations of the Assessment Group are to fund the following:
