1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 The report makes recommendations for the allocation of grant awards from the Music Development Projects Fund.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The grants totalling £27,500 will be met from the Department's 2010/11 Revenue Budget.

4.0 MAIN TEXT

- 4.1 In recent years there has been increased pressure on the Music Development Projects budget to meet the demands of the on-going development of music within the City.
- 4.2 To further enable the Music Development Projects budget to be utilised in a strategic manner, all organisations who receive funding from this budget have been asked to submit an application form, a financial statement and a copy of their constitution. Applications from the following organisations have been received and assessed, and recommendations for funding are detailed below. These grants will assist the organisations with the delivery of programmes.

Caird Hall Programming	To support programming of Classical, Jazz and World music concerts at the Caird Hall Complex.	£3,000
