1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report seeks approval to provide funding to local Playgroups, Out of School Care Clubs and Parent and Toddler groups.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Education Committee note and approve the proposals contained within this report and:

- 2.1 approve the award of funding to Parent and Toddler Groups and Playgroups as outlined in Appendix 1 of this Report
- 2.2 approve the award of funding to Out of School Care Clubs as outlined in Appendix 2 of this Report
- 2.3 approve the award of funding to the Dundee Out of School Care Network as outlined in Appendix 3 of this Report

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The full cost of this proposal is £75,428.30 which will be met from Scottish Executive funding made available to the local authority for Childcare Strategy.

4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

4.1 This proposal will result in increased access to opportunities and the development of skills and knowledge needed to enable everyone to play a full part in society

5.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

5.1 This proposal will enhance choice and diversity in early years provision and will contribute to improve links with parents and strengthen partnerships across sectors.

6.0 BACKGROUND

- 6.1 Since the beginning of Childcare Strategy Funding in 1999, Dundee City Council has agreed to provide funding to a range of Voluntary Sector Groups involved in the delivery of services. This Report seeks approval to continue this funding.
- 6.2 **Parent and Toddler Groups** offer parents and their young children an opportunity to play, learn and make new friends in their local community. Groups meet for sessions during the week depending on local circumstances. Parent and Toddler Groups, are run by local parents and carers who form committees to plan and organise the programme. Parent and Toddler Groups are often the first group experience for parents and their young children and are often able to signpost additional services to parents.
- 6.3 **Playgroups** offer children opportunities for play following the National 3-5 Curriculum Framework. Parents take turns on duty enabling them to spend time with their children and to contribute voluntarily to their community. Children's social and emotional development is promoted and many children meet their nursery and primary school peers for the first time in playgroup.
- 6.4 **Out of School Care Clubs**, run outwith school hours and offer children opportunities for a range of leisure, learning and sports activities and supporting parents who require childcare for employment and training purposes. They provide non profit making childcare for school age children and an invaluable service to working parents. Parents pay sessional fees for this service.
- 6.5 The **Dundee Out of School Care Network** works in partnership with the Early Years and Childcare Team to support the infrastructure of Out of School Care In Dundee. An important aspect of this recently has been the provision of business development advice and payroll support to clubs. Management Committees and Club staff have recognised the importance of this support and as the network of clubs grows across the City there is a recognition that this kind of support now needs to be extended.

7.0 PROPOSAL

- 7.1 The groups described above are dependent on the support and involvement of parents and in order to make the services widely affordable are often run on very tight budgets. These groups make a significant contribution to the delivery of Dundee's Early Years and Childcare Strategy and provide a choice and diversity of service provision within the City. These proposals have been developed in partnership with members of Dundee Early Years and Childcare Team, committee members and parents using the groups
- 7.2 Childcare Strategy Funding will support the sustainability and ongoing development of the groups and safeguard the services for the benefit of children and their families across the City.
- 7.3 In addition, a significant aspect of the funding is to promote anti- poverty measures particularly within Out of School Clubs, for example by widening the range of opportunities available to children attending Clubs, reducing fees for children in targeted groups, supporting children with additional support needs and providing enhanced support for Clubs in areas of economic and social deprivation. In order to disburse Poverty Package Funding fairly and equitably to clubs within Dundee it is proposed that Dundee Out of School Care Network set up a sub group specifically to allocate funding to clubs.

- 7.4 Dundee Out of School Care Network is a fully constituted group which represents all out of school care clubs within Dundee. Poverty Package Funding should be used within specific criteria which includes: the provision of innovative ways to enable children, previously excluded from the club through poverty, to access the provision by offering parents reduced charges, an improvement in the quality of their provision by the introduction of a healthy eating programme which will improve snack time after school and also during full day care, or the provision of innovative ways of introducing the children to healthy lifestyle choices through club activities, speakers, trips and visits.
- 7.5 Funding applications were made in consultation with the Dundee Out of School Clubs Network and the Scottish Pre – School Play Association Coordinator. Groups listed in the Appendices attached to this Report have provided funding applications in line with criteria set by the Team. The impact of the funding in contributing to the delivery of the targets contained within Dundee's Early Years and Childcare Strategy will be monitored and evaluated by the Early Years and Childcare Team.
- 7.6 The recent pilot to support Out of School Care Clubs and their Committees with the business aspect of their provision has been highly successful. Feedback has shown that a number of voluntary parent management committees and their clubs have benefited from this much needed business advice and support. A range of concerns including personnel, finance, book keeping and legal issues have been addressed and it is proposed to extend this support across the out of school care sector. This type of support falls directly within the criteria for Poverty Package funding as, by improving the skill bases within management committees and improving the financial security within clubs, it directly supports sustainability and economic viability in areas of deprivation. It is now proposed to increase the business development advice from 6 hours weekly to 15. The Business Development Adviser is employed by the Dundee Out of School Care Network and is supported by the Early Years and Childcare Team.
- 7.7 It is widely acknowledged that quality of provision within the out of school care sector varies considerably between clubs. In order to improve quality of care and provide a consistent approach to supporting quality in all clubs in Dundee the Quality Framework Document has been developed. This document is the result of a multi-agency working group approach and has been written to support club staff and their management committees. The Quality Framework Document was launched to all out of school care staff at a successful launch event in February 2004.

8.0 CONSULTATION

This report has been the subject of consultation with the Chief Executive, Depute Chief Executive (Support Services), Depute Chief Executive (Finance), Director of Social Work, and Head of Communities.

9.0 BACKGROUND PAPERS
