### **6.0 MAIN TEXT**

6.1 At the Policy and Resources Committee on 28 June 2002 (Report No 71-2002) authority was given to the Dundee Community Safety Partnership to make small grant awards up to the value of £500 to voluntary/community organisations. The specific grant awards made for the financial year 2006-2007 are detailed in Appendix 1.

6.2 The strategic priorities for the Partnership for the period involved were as follows:

- Tackling Substance and Alcohol Misuse.
- Improving Road Safety with Special Emphasis on Young People.
- Reducing Crime and the Fear of Crime.

- Building and Sustaining the Community's Capacity to Participate in Community Safety Activities.
- Reducing Antisocial behaviour.
- Improving Vulnerable Individual/Group Personal Safety.
- Promoting Fire Safety and Awareness.
- Mainstreaming Community Safety Activity.

6.3 Twenty percent of the 2005-2006 Awards have received follow up audit checks as part of ongoing grant quality assurance arrangements.
