## **1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1.1 This report seeks approval for four awards to be made from Social Inclusion Partnership 1.

## **2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS**

Approval is requested for payments to be made to the following:

2.1 Ardler Arabians – S1SG/78 – to the value of £5,000. This grant for equipment for a group involving young people in gymnastics.

2.2 Dundee Energy Efficiency Advice Project – S1SG/79 – to the value of £3,500. This grant is for equipment to support the project's ability to communicate with the potential beneficiaries of its work.

2.3 Adult Learning Team – S1SG/86 – to the value of £3,240. This grant is for display material and boards to assist in the promotion of Adult Learning across the SIP 1 areas.

2.4 Kirkton Support – S1SG/84 – to the value of £2,350. For equipment relating to the projects activity programme. Focussing on small scale "community business" and health.

## **3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

3.1 The recommended awards totalling £14,090 can be contained within the SIP1 core budget for the current financial year 2002/2003.

## **4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS**

4.1 Priority has been given to revenue expenditure that is likely to be of benefit to the environment in the target areas. Also, meeting local needs is a central focus of the strategy for community regeneration and, as such, these measures will impact on numerous Agenda 21 targets.

## **5.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS**

5.1 The resources made available through the Social Inclusion Partnership Fund for geographic neighbourhoods are targeted on those which fall within the most disadvantaged 10% of enumeration districts at the time of the last Census. The funding made available for the Social Inclusion Partnerships is intended to have the effect of equalling opportunities.

## **6.0 BACKGROUND**

6.1 This approval is sought to ensure maximum uplift of the Social Inclusion Partnership grant available to Dundee in the current financial year.
