6.1 The Al-Maktoum Institute for Arabic and Islamic Studies will be officially opened In May 2002. The Institute will be a division of the School of Social and Health Sciences within the University of Abertay. The Institute will be

the first academic institution of its kind in Scotland and it is hoped will enhance both the academic and international reputation of Dundee City. It is anticipated that establishment of the Institute will also signal the beginning of a wider relationship between the city of Dundee and Dubai, home of the Institute's sponsor, His Highness Shaikh Handan Bin Rashid Al-Maktoum.

One of the aims of the Institute is to serve the local community. It is hoped that, in addition to its other work, the Institute will provide a range of educational opportunities for teachers and pupils in Dundee to gain a wider knowledge of Islam and Arabic culture. This will build on Dundee's already strong multicultural tradition.

7.0 CONCLUSIONS

7.1

The official opening of the Institute will be a significant development for the University of Abertay and for the City of Dundee. In recognition of this event it is proposed that a Memorandum of Understanding be signed by representatives of Dundee City Council Education Department and of the Institute. The Memorandum recognises The Education Department's commitment to working in partnership with all higher education institutions in the City and looks forward to developing educational links between the Institute and Dundee schools.
