1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report sets out the 2021 Development Plan Scheme for the Dundee Local Development Plan.

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee:

- a approves the Development Plan Scheme 2021 as set out in Appendix 1;
- b remits the Executive Director of City Development to refer the Development Plan Scheme 2021 to the Scottish Government for information; and
- c remits the Executive Director of City Development to publish and implement the Development Plan Scheme 2021.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 None.

4 BACKGROUND

4.1 The Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 as amended, requires each Planning Authority to prepare a Development Plan Scheme, and review it annually.

4.2 The Development Plan Scheme is required to set out the Authority's programme for preparing and reviewing its Local Development Plan and seeks to provide a general indication of what is involved in each stage, together with dates for key stages.

4.3 The Development Plan Scheme must also include a "participation statement" stating the expected arrangements for consultation on the Plan preparation.

4.4 After adopting the Development Plan Scheme, the Act requires the Authority to publish it, send two copies to Scottish Ministers and make copies available in public libraries.

4.5 The current Dundee Local Development Plan was adopted in February 2019. Legislation requires the Council to undertake a review of its Local Development Plan regularly to ensure that an up-to-date plan is always in place.

4.6 The Development Plan Scheme 2021, as contained in the appendix to this report, identifies the currently expected dates for the review of the existing Dundee Local Development Plan 2019.

4.7 The Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 will lead to significant change in respect Development Planning in Scotland. This includes changes to the Local Development Plan preparation process, with the Scottish Government intending to publish new regulations and guidance in 2022. However, the requirement to prepare a Development Plan Scheme as set out in paragraph 4.1 above remains and to comply with the provisions of the 1997 Act, a Development Plan Scheme must be prepared this year. This Development Plan Scheme has been prepared in advance of the new regulations and guidance to implement the 2019 Act being published by

the Scottish Government. As a consequence, there will be a need to revise the timescales and processes outlined in the Development Plan Scheme 2021 when the Scottish Government publishes the necessary information on the new arrangements.

APPENDIX 1

Dundee Local Development Plan Scheme 2021

This Development Plan Scheme is published by Dundee City Council with regards to the preparation of the Dundee Local Development Plan. It contains updated information on the progress made towards preparing the Dundee Local Development Plan and expected timescales for the plan preparation process.

Background

The Planning etc (Scotland) Act 2006 introduced a process for the preparation of Strategic Development Plans covering the four main city regions of Scotland and preparation of Local Development Plans. Subsequently the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 altered the method for preparing Development Plans.

The TAYplan Strategic Development Plan was approved in October 2017 and along with the Dundee Local Development Plan 2019 and its associated supplementary planning guidance form the statutory Development Plan for the Dundee City Council Area. These were both prepared and adopted under the terms of the Planning etc (Scotland) Act 2006. Future Local Development Plans will be prepared in compliance with the requirements of the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019.

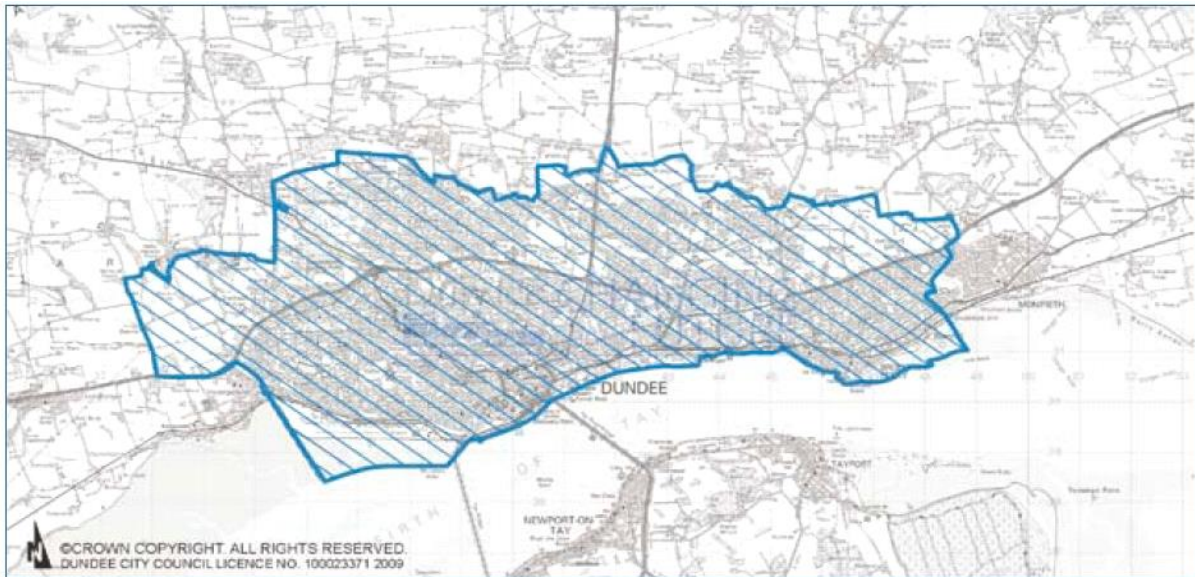
The preparation of the current Strategic Development Plan for this area was undertaken by the TAYplan Strategic Development Planning Authority (SDPA), whilst Dundee City Council undertakes the preparation of the Dundee Local Development Plan.

Under the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 Strategic Development Plans will no longer be produced but groupings of authorities will instead identify the need and proposed locations for strategic development through the preparation of Regional Spatial Strategies. The process for the preparation of Local Development Plans will change and will require to be replaced every 10 years rather than the current 5-year period. In addition, local communities will have the opportunity to prepare Local Place Plans to set out development or use of land in particular areas. Local Place Plans will not form part of the LDP. However, they must be considered when an LDP is prepared.

This Development Plan Scheme refers only to the Dundee Local Development Plan.

The Dundee Local Development Plan 2019 covers the entire Dundee City Council administrative area and will remain as the statutory plan until such time as a replacement Local Development Plan is adopted.

Preparation of a new Local Development Plan

The implementation and implications of the Planning (Scotland) Act 2019 will affect the preparation of a new Local Development Plan. The most recent advice from Scottish Government is that the new regulations and guidance relating to the preparation of Local Development Plans will come into force in Summer 2022. It is intended to undertake some preparatory work on reviewing the Dundee Local Development Plan 2019 prior to the publication of these regulations.

This Development Plan Scheme is based on our understanding of the requirements of the 2019 Act. It is likely that this will require revision following the publication of regulations by the Scottish Government in 2022.

Strategic Environmental Assessment

The Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 makes Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) a legal requirement for certain plans, programmes and strategies, including the Local Development Plan.

The purpose of SEA is to provide proper consideration for the environment by ensuring that environmental issues are considered by decision makers alongside economic and social issues. This is achieved by systematically assessing the potential significant environmental effects of the Plan. The process involves a number of key stakeholders including the Scottish Environment Protection Agency, Scottish Natural Heritage, and Historic Scotland.

The SEA is undertaken in conjunction with the preparation of the Local Development Plan and the findings published in an environment report.

Habitats Regulation Appraisal

A Habitats Regulation Appraisal (HRA) is mandatory under the Conservation (Natural Habitats) Regulations 1994, as amended. Its purpose is to screen which policies or proposals may have an impact on the conservation objectives and qualifying features of Special Conservation Areas or Special Protection Areas.

The preparation of the HRA is undertaken in consultation with Scottish Natural Heritage and the outcomes published alongside any Proposed Dundee Local Development Plan.
