PERFORMANCE RESULTS

1st APRIL 2013 TO 30th JUNE 2013

RECOMMENDATION

2 RECORDED CRIME

2.1 Dundee LPA evidenced reductions in violent crime when compared to the average of the previous 5 years

A reduction in overall violent crime of 20% (14 fewer victims)

A reduction in serious assaults of 10% (3 fewer victims)

A reduction in robbery of 48% (10 fewer victims)

A reduction in common assault of 7% (42 fewer victims)

2.2 Reductions were also achieved in

Housebreaking (including attempts) – 45% (58 fewer victims)

Shoplifting - 12% (58 fewer victims)

Vandalism – 35% (227 fewer victims)

2.3 Overall, Group 1-4¹ recorded 2,243 crimes and evidenced a reduction of 16% compared with the 5 year average (430 fewer crimes).

¹ Groups 1-4 refer to an amalgamation of four crime groups. They are Group 1, consisting of violent crime; Group 2 covering sexual offences; Group 3, the largest, covers a wide range of crimes of dishonesty; and Group 4 includes vandalism, fire-raising, and malicious mischief.)



2.4 91 crimes of indecency were recorded, a 68.5% increase on the 5 year average of 54. However, it should be noted that approximately 30 of these crimes had been retrospectively reported and did not occur this year. Recent, well publicised cases involving historic abuse have, perhaps, given victims greater confidence to report matters to the police knowing they will be thoroughly investigated. Some of the crimes were linked and involved the same victims and/or perpetrator. There was also an increase in crimes linked to the use of internet, phones etc.

3 DETECTION RATES

3.1 Improvements in detection rates, against the 5 year average were evidenced in the following:-

Serious assault 88.0% - 5 year average 77.5% Common assault 68.9% - 5 year average 68.0% Vandalism 29.2% - 5 year average 28.0%

3.2 Detection rates for the following were below the 5 year average

Robbery 36.4% - 5 year average 65.0% Housebreaking (including attempts) 19.4% - 5 year average 32.0% Shoplifting 78.5% - 5 year average 88.0%

3.3 Significant detection rates for the following were above the five year average and this is due to an emphasis on enforcement to influence driver behaviour to keep people safe and deny criminals use of the road networks:-

Dangerous Driving 16 – 5 year average 10 Speeding 352 – 5 year average 139 Seatbelts 209 – 5 year average 48 Mobile Phones 194 – 5 year average 47
