1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To authorise the purchase of the vehicles listed below, which are to be used for a range of services within the Waste Management Department.

The vehicles are to be procured via Scotland Excel Vehicle Framework Contract.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The total cost of the vehicles is £737,126. Provision for this expenditure has been made in the Waste Management Department's Capital Budget for 2009/10.

4.0 MAIN TEXT

- 4.1 The vehicles recommended for purchase in paragraph 2 will replace existing vehicles which have reached the end of their economic life.
- 4.2 In order to assist the Council in meeting the objectives of its Carbon Management Plan, the vehicles to be purchased are fitted with engines of Euro 4 and Euro 5 standard which are the cleanest emission versions available. All of the vehicles listed above are being procured via the Scotland Excel framework which includes environmental performance as part of it contract award criteria.
