## 6 BACKGROUND

## 6.1 Dangerous Building Notices

The City Engineer investigated 19 incidents relating to public safety of dangerous buildings during the month of April 2003. No formal Notice was issued under Section 13(1c) of the Building (Scotland) Act 1959.

Direct action has been taken in 3 instances to ensure public safety is maintained under Section 13(1b) of the Building (Scotland) Act 1959.

- 6.2.28 Eden Street-Loose slates hanging in the front and rear<br/>gutters. Removed by Dundee Contract<br/>Services.
- 6.2.3 <u>163 Clepington Road</u> Loose slate in the front gutter. Removed by Dundee Contract Services. Awaiting Owners
