## **1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1.1 Report for information to Committee. The I.T. Equipment purchased under the Government Procurement Service and Procurement Scotland Framework Agreements.

## **2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 The Committee is recommended to:

- i) Note the I.T. purchases amounting to £ 422,656 detailed in appendix 1. This covers the period 21 May 2012 to 19 October 2012
- ii) Approve ongoing engineering maintenance costs of £ 13,365 per annum for the above purchases.

## **3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

- 3.1 The Director of Corporate Services has confirmed that equipment with a capital value of £ 83,093 has been funded through the current year's allowance of £ 839,000 for the purpose of Computer Equipment in the Corporate Services Department's Capital Plan.
- 3.2 The Director of Corporate Services has confirmed that equipment with a capital value of £ 189,058 has been funded through the current year's allowance of £ 570,000 for the purposes of Schools Computer purchases in the Corporate Services Capital Plan.
- 3.3 The Director of Corporate Services has confirmed that software licenses with a revenue cost of £ 121,410 has been funded through the current years Revenue budget of £ 1,768,000 for Computing Costs.
- 3.4 Equipment with a value of £ 29,095 has been funded through existing departmental budgets.
- 3.5 The annual recurring engineering maintenance costs of £ 13,365 will be met from the 2012/2013 Revenue expenditure for the I.T. Division.

## **4.0 MAIN TEXT**

- 4.1 The Policy and Resources Committee (900-2002) of 16 December 2002 approved the OGC Catalyst Procurement Scheme (now known as the Government Procurement Service) as a permanent means of purchasing I.T. equipment.
- 4.2 The above report remitted the Head of Information Technology to report regularly to the Policy and Resources Committee on the I.T. purchases made through the above scheme.
- 4.3 Procurement Scotland Framework Agreements have also been used to ensure best value is obtained in I.T. purchases.
- 4.4 Appendix 1 details the purchases made from 21 May 2012 until 19 October 2012.

## **5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

5.1 This Report has been screened for any policy implications in respect of Sustainability, Strategic Environmental Assessment, Anti-Poverty, Equality Impact Assessment and Risk Assessment. The major issues identified are:

- i) For the operation and maintenance of a wide range of I.T. equipment and support systems, consideration will be given in support of all service developments in line with the **Purchasing and Procurement** principles of the Sustainability Policy.
- ii) The impact of this policy will have the combined effect of reducing energy costs, life cycle costs and ensure sustainable recycling of equipment at end of useful life.
