1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to set out proposed changes to the delivery of the Community Learning and Development Service. Approval is sought to introduce these changes for 2024/25.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 It is recommended committee approves the changes as set out in section 4 and summarised at 4.4.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The changes set out in this report generate a saving of £74,000 towards the delivery of a balanced budget for the City Council financial year 24/25.
- 3.2 These savings will be achieved through deletion of vacant posts and removal of Youth Fund revenue budget

4.0 MAIN TEXT

- 4.1 All areas of the CLD service have been looked at to identify where there could be changes to respond to budget pressures whilst still meeting our statutory requirements.
- Youth Parliament and Dundee Youth Forum. It is planned to change the current model of providing dedicated staff support to Members of the Scottish Youth Parliament (MSYP) and Dundee Youth Forum. There is not a statutory requirement for this to be a dedicated stand-alone support and it will be allocated as part of the area youth work teams. Individual and groupwork support to MSYP's and Dundee Youth Council will continue to be provided through core CLD Youth Work Provision. This will generate a saving of £49,000.
- 4.3 **Youth Fund**. A dedicated Youth Fund has been administered through Participatory Budgeting and has provided amounts of up to £2,500 for organisations to bid into and the final spend has been decided by young people through an online vote. The organisations who bid in are not dependent on this funding for their core delivery. The fund, in the main, supported non-essential additional opportunities and activities, therefore it is proposed discontinue this fund, which generates a saving of £25,000.
- 4.4 In summary, the changes in services provided will generate a saving of £74,000 towards the 2024/25 Neighbourhood Services revenue budget.

5. POLICY IMPLICATIONS
