1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To advise Committee of the Dundee ECO Stars Fleet Recognition Scheme and the launch event at Discovery Point on the 13th December 2013

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 It is recommended that Committee notes the aims of the ECO Stars Fleet Recognition Scheme and the launch of the Scheme in Dundee.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The expenditure required for the financial year 2013/2014 can be met from the Environment Department's revenue budget. The Director of Corporate Services advises that all costs will be met from the Scottish Government Air Quality Grant 2013/14.

4.0 MAIN TEXT

- 4.1 The Environment Act 1995 and associated regulations established the Local Air Quality Management system (LAQM), under which all local authorities in Scotland are required to regularly review and assess air quality in their areas against objectives for several pollutants of particular concern for human health. If this work indicates that any objective will not be achieved by the required date, the authority concerned must declare an Air Quality Management Area (AQMA) and produce an action plan outlining how it intends to tackle the issues identified.
- 4.2 In accordance with our statutory responsibilities the Council has declared an AQMA in respect of the annual mean for nitrogen dioxide and fine particulates and the hourly mean objective for nitrogen dioxide. The Council's Air Quality Action Plan was approved in January 2011 and it contains 32 different measures that will help improve air quality in the city. The ECO Stars Fleet Recognition Scheme meets the aims of Measure 6 which aims to reduce emissions from Heavy Goods Vehicles.
- 4.3 ECO Stars was originally created in South Yorkshire and has since been adopted by other areas in the UK including Nottingham, Falkirk, Mid Devon, City of York, and Edinburgh as well as several cities across Europe. In total, the schemes have more than 150 members with over 14,000 vehicles The ECO Stars is a scheme which engages with commercial operators at a local level encouraging and helping them to reduce the impact of their transport activities on air guality and the environment.
- 4.4 The scheme aims to provide recognition and guidance on environmental best practice to operators of goods vehicles, buses and coaches whose fleet are either based in or regularly serve the city. The voluntary scheme is free to join and comes with the added benefit of providing tools and on-going support for operators to reduce costs and their environmental impact. The ECO Stars initiative provides another tool to assist the council in reducing air pollution within the city through positive engagement with the various transport operators in the city. As a fleet operator the Council is entitled to join the scheme and thus benefit from improved operational efficiency.

4.5 The Council was awarded £33k from the Scottish Government's Air Quality Grant 2013/14 to set up the Dundee ECO Stars Fleet Recognition Scheme in the city. South Yorkshire holds the intellectual property rights for the ECO Stars scheme concept, and all schemes are assisted by Transport & Travel Research Ltd, who provides the necessary technical support and engagement with the transport sector. The Dundee ECO Stars scheme is being rolled out in Dundee by Transport and Travel Research Ltd in preparation for the official launch on Friday 13th December at the Discovery Point.

5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

5.1 This report has been screened for any policy implications in respect of Sustainability, Strategic Environmental Assessment, Anti-poverty, Equality Impact Assessment and Risk Management. There are no major issues.
