1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report seeks approval to make better and more efficient use of Council vehicles and generating additional income for use of vehicles by third parties.

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 It is recommended that the approval is given to make better and more efficient use of Council vehicles and generating additional income for use of vehicles by third parties.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 There is scope for further efficiency in managing Dundee City Council's vehicles outwith core hours of operations.
- 3.2 Through making the council's passenger vehicles available more widely, for hire, with self-drive or with driver provided options available it is estimated that £35k per annum income could be achieved.

4 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Dundee City Council has a large fleet of vehicles that are utilised every working day as pool vehicles, passenger transport of young and older persons and other Council uses. Aside from a small amount of community based sharing, many vehicles are underutilised outside of Monday to Friday 0800-1800hrs and there is, therefore, an opportunity to use these vehicles more efficiently.
- 4.2 By offering third parties access to the fleet outwith the peak hours, an affordable transport hire service could be provided and additional income to the Council could be achieved.
- 4.3 A new approach to passenger transport and fleet utilisation has been identified which allows the hiring out our vehicles and/or drivers and would yield an income to assist cover the cost of the fleet in operation.

5 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

5.1 This Report has been screened for any policy implications in respect of Sustainability, Strategic Environmental Assessment, Anti-Poverty, Equality Impact Assessment and Risk Management. There are no major issues.
