1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is to agree the City Council's submission to the Scottish Executive in respect of how it proposes to use the Quality of Life monies for the two financial years 2006/2007 and 2007/2008.

- 2.1 Agrees the Quality of Life submissions for 2006/2007 and 2007/2008 as detailed in Appendix A.
- 2.2 Instructs the Depute Chief Executive (Finance) to ensure that the Council's Quality of Life submission is made to the Scottish Executive by 30 November 2005 (as detailed in Appendix B).
- 2.3 Notes that the required provisions for Quality of Life are included in the Provisional Revenue Budgets for 2006/2007 and 2007/2008 respectively.

5 BACKGROUND

- 5.1 Following the success of Quality of Life funding for 2003-2006, the Minister for Finance and Public Service Reform announced on 29 September 2004 the outcome of the Spending Review 2004 which included a total allocation of £100m of Quality of Life funding for local authorities over financial years 2006/2007 and 2007/2008.
- 5.2 The above allocation was included in the Local Government Finance Settlement figures announced in December 2004 spread equally over financial years 2006/2007 and 2007/2008.

The City Council's share of the £100m over the two financial years is as follows:

Financial Year	<u>£m</u>
2006/2007 2007/2008	1.467 <u>1.463</u> <u>2.930</u>

The above amounts were included in the 2005-2008 Revenue Budget, submitted to the Special Finance Committee meeting on 10 February 2005 and are held centrally in a

contingency pending the identification and approval of a detailed programme of departmental projects.

- 5.3 The Ministers have intimated that they expect the Quality of Life Funds to be used to reflect the shared central and local government priorities of **improving the local environment** and **improving community well-being**.
- 5.4 Councils have been encouraged to aim to co-ordinate their spending proposals under the above two themes with other funding and priorities for neighbourhoods. This can include using Quality of Life funding to support:
 - Regeneration Outcome Agreements
 - Joint Health Improvement Plans
 - Antisocial Behaviour Outcome Agreements
 - Integrated Children's Services Plans
 - Services for Older People
 - Environmental Improvements
- 5.5 Finally, due to the cross-cutting nature of the Quality of Life themes, the Council have been asked to involve its community planning partners in the formulation of proposals to ensure that projects reflect agreed strategic priorities of the partnerships. The Council's community planning partners have been fully consulted in the development of the attached spending proposals, through the Community Plan Co-ordinating Group.
- 5.6 The Scottish Executive have asked that the Council makes a submission setting out how it proposes to use funds in line with the policy themes for 2006/2007, and indicative plans for 2007/2008. Attached to this report, as Appendix B, is the proposed 2006/2007 and 2007/2008 submission on Quality of Life for the Committee's consideration.

All Chief Officers of the City Council have been consulted on the contents of this report, together with the Council's community planning partners.
