- 6.1 Reference is made to the report made to the meeting of Education Committee held on 17th March 2003 when expenditure of £75,000 was approved in respect of the above project and Building Environmental Hygiene Dundee were appointed to carry out the work.
- 6.2 Following inspections and tests carried out as part of the routine bi-annual and annual inspections, remedial works are required to a number of the properties. Replacement tanks, alterations and renewal of piping and valves beyond the scope originally anticipated are now required to ensure that the appropriate standards are met. Further properties in the Harris Academy Cluster will also be included. The additional cost of these works is expected to be in the region of £30,000 inclusive of an allowance for professional fees.
