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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

This report represents and discusses the findings to emerge from Dundee City Council's Citizen Survey 2016. This survey has also been carried out for a number of years previously, most recently in 2015.

The specific research objectives of the 2016 Citizen Survey were as follows.

- To establish the public's views on general and specific aspects of life in Dundee, including:
 - The home and neighbourhood
 - Health
 - Education and employment
 - Community safety
 - Financial issues.
- To establish levels of satisfaction with public services
- To establish the customer experience when contacting the Council
- To strengthen the evidence base which will support and inform the development of Dundee's Single Outcome Agreement.

A total of 1807 interviews were carried out with a representative sample of Dundee residents. The sample structure was designed to replicate the sampling methodology and structure utilised in the previous survey. This involved a disproportionate sampling methodology where:

- 800 interviews were completed with the general population of Dundee (100 in each of the 8 wards)
- 1,000 interviews were carried out within community regeneration areas (200 in each of the 5 regeneration areas)

The following summarises the key findings under each of the research themes, noting significant changes that have been seen over the last 3 years of surveys since 2013. Subsequent chapters of the report analyse this in further detail.

KEY FINDINGS

- The best aspects of living in **the neighbourhood** have remained consistent over the last 4 years with the neighbourhood being quiet and peaceful and the neighbours being the top two reasons provided. Similarly, the majority of respondents, as has been the case over the last 4 years, believed that there has been no change in the neighbourhood.
- With regard to the **local area and services**, satisfaction has remained consistently high, maintaining satisfaction levels in the high 90%'s. The proportion of respondents stating very satisfied varies significantly from 8% in terms of the Community Warden Service to 65% in terms of sports and leisure facilities.
- When thinking about the **accessibility of local services**, respondents were most likely to consider, public transport (59%), sports and leisure facilities (45%) and local youth facilities (42%) to be very easy to access.
- Overall satisfaction with the neighbourhood was high, however the proportion of respondents stating very satisfied was highest in terms of, shopping facilities (60%), the natural environment (43%) and the built environment (39%).
- Quality of life in the neighbourhood has remained consistently high, maintaining the overall satisfaction levels since 2013. However, the proportion of respondents who were *very* satisfied with the quality of life in their neighbourhood has increased from 61% in 2015 to 69% in 2016.

- This trend was also seen in the question which asked respondents about the quality of life in Dundee with 62% of respondents being very satisfied in 2015 to 72% in 2016.
- When asked about their **participation profile**, the levels of volunteering has increased from 8% in 2015 to 12% in 2016.
- 37% of respondents felt that they could **influence decisions** affecting their local area. The proportion of respondents who felt they could influence decisions affecting their local area has decreased by just 3 percentage points since the 2015 survey.
- In relation to **health**, whilst there has been a marginal variance in self-reported health over the last 3 years, this variation has not been statistically significant, with the underlying trend since 2013 rising only 2 percentage points. The proportion of respondents who felt their health was very good has increased significantly since the 2015 survey, increasing from 45% to 60%.
- The proportion of respondents who stated that they have never **smoked** has been subject to marginal variance since 2013, however the trend has seen no significant change since 2013.
- The proportion of respondents who stated that they never drink the recommended **alcohol allowance** has increased significantly since the 2015 survey and it at its highest level to date with 56% of respondents stating they never drink the recommended allowance.
- Feelings of safety in the neighbourhood have remained fairly consistent, with respondents most likely to feel very safe walking alone in their neighbourhood during the day (89%), and in their home during the day (94%) and at night (92%). The proportion of respondents who said they felt very safe walking alone in their neighbourhood after dark has decreased from 62% in 2013 to 50% in 2016.
- The vast majority of respondents were of the opinion that the amount of **crime** has remained the same over the last year. This has decreased from 73% in 2013 to 68% in 2016.
- In terms of **financial profile**, the proportion of respondents who have a bank or building society account has not seen any significant change since 2013, with the vast majority of respondents having a bank or building society account.
- When considering **financial management**, the proportion of respondents who said their household is managing quite well or very well has increased significantly from 42% in 2013 to 63% in 2016. The biggest financial concerns for respondents were the cost of food and domestic energy bills. However the proportion of respondents stating that they were having difficulty in affording these has continued to decrease from 2013 to 2016.
- In relation to the **method of contact** used when respondents are contacting the Council over the last year, the majority have contacted the Council by telephone over the four year period.
- Satisfaction with the contact has remained consistent in relation to complaints over the 4 year period. However, satisfaction with contact to seek information has increased since the 2013 survey increasing from 91% in 2013 to 97% in 2016. The proportion of respondents very satisfied with the contact to request a service has increased significantly since the 2015 survey increasing from 54% to 74%.
- When asked to consider their **priorities for the Council**, there has been some variance in relation to the extent to which they are priorities. However, all four of the top priorities reported in 2016 have remained consistent since 2013; providing an efficient service, providing services which are value for money, offering a good range of services and providing a good quality service. Tackling important issues for the future of the area and ensuring sustainable use of resources and care for the environment have both seen an increase in priority since 2013 (increased by 5 and 9 percentage points respectively). 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1. INTRODUCTION, BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

1.1 Introduction

This report represents and discusses the findings to emerge from Dundee City Council's Citizen Survey 2016 which was undertaken by Research Resource. This survey has also been carried out for a number of years previously, most recently in 2015.

1.2 Objectives

The specific research objectives of the 2016 Citizen Survey were as follows.

 - Education and employment
 - Community safety

- To establish levels of satisfaction with public services
- To establish the customer experience when contacting the Council
- To strengthen the evidence base which will support and inform the development of Dundee's Single Outcome Agreement.

1.3 Methodology

A total of 1807 interviews were carried out with a representative sample of Dundee residents. The sample structure was designed to replicate the sampling methodology and structure utilised in the previous survey. This involved a disproportionate sampling methodology where:

- 800 interviews were completed with the general population of Dundee (A target of 100 in each of the 8 wards)
- 1,000 interviews were carried out within community regeneration areas (200 in each of the 5 regeneration areas)

The "disproportionate" sampling approach was used previously and involves delivering the same number of interviews in each Ward or regeneration area, regardless of the actual population size of the area. This ensures the data for each Ward or regeneration area can be directly compared (with the same level of accuracy). The "disproportionate" aspect is eliminated in the results by applying appropriate statistical reweighting to balance survey data to be reflective of the entire population.

Within each area, a random sample was drawn to ensure coverage across each area. Interviewing was scheduled over day time, evening and weekends to ensure all segments of the working and non-working population had the opportunity to participate.

The table below illustrates the final number of interviews achieved, by Ward, and the margin of error associated with the data collected:

The 2016 questionnaire was developed from the 2015 survey questionnaire. The 2015 questionnaire was revised and the following amendments were agreed:

- Q10/11 were reduced in size eliminating the following codes; local health facilities, local schools, social care/social work, social housing, street lighting, parks and open spaces, local phone boxes, local shops and access to free cash machines.
- Q12, children's play areas was replaced with areas for children to play outside.
- Q15, two new codes were added which were clubs and groups for pre-school age children and local school as community facility.
- A new question was introduced at Q36 asking respondents what in their opinion was the main issues for children and young people in their area.
- A new question was introduced at Q56 asking respondents if they knew who to contact if they had concerns that a child was at risk of being abused.

1.4 Interviewing and quality control

All interviewing was undertaken by Research Resource's highly trained and experienced field force, all of whom are highly experienced in undertaking customer and resident surveys for Local Authorities. Interviewing took place between the 17th October and the 20th December.

All interviews were completed in accordance with our ISO20252 accredited policies and procedures and in accordance with the Market Research Society Code of Conduct.

Upon completion of interviews, completed questionnaires are manually edited, checking for quality and consistency of interviews. As a further validation, 10% of each interviewers quota of interviews are checked through 'back checking' which involves re contacting the participant by telephone and verifying key details about the interview and ensuring that interviewers were polite, pleasant and showed identification.

1.5 Data analysis

A SNAP database was designed to conduct the data processing and analysis. SNAP Data Entry software was used to enter the data which ensures accuracy of response and reduces data entry operator error. Once the data was entered, appropriate range and logic checks were applied and open-ended questions were coded. Data tables were then produced for each of the different levels of reports required (overall Dundee level, for wards, and for regeneration areas).

Due to the fact that the sample was designed on a disproportionate basis within wards, to ensure the data was representative at both Dundee and ward level, weighting figures were used during the data analysis. The data was weighted by age, gender and ward. The profile figures used in the weighting calculations were based upon Scotland's Census 2011. In particular this was carried out in order to ensure that the results on a ward basis were proportionately represented in the results in relation to the proportion of the Dundee population who live in that ward.

1.6 Presentation and Interpretation of Results

This report details the findings of the survey for the Dundee City Council area overall and includes some comparisons between different groups where appropriate and statistically significant. To allow for more in depth analysis at Ward and regeneration area level, separate top line reports have also been prepared for each of the multi-member ward and regeneration areas and are available under a separate cover of Appendix 2.

In reading these reports, a number of points should be noted:

- The findings are based upon a sample of residents, rather than the whole population of Dundee being interviewed, therefore, all results are subject to sampling tolerances. At the overall Dundee level the margin of error associated with the results is +/-2.3%. This is a body of data which should be considered robust and Dundee City Council and Dundee Partnership should have confidence in.
- Results have been compared to the previous 2011, 2012,2013, 2014 and 2015 Dundee Citizen Surveys as appropriate, but in comparing results, it should be noted that:
 - Not all differences between the 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015 surveys will be statistically significant.
 - o The demographics of the area may have changed in this period.

When reporting the data in this document, in general, percentages in tables have been rounded to the nearest whole number. Responses greater than 0% but less than 0.5% are shown as 0% and responses between 0.5% and less than 1% are rounded to 1%. Columns may not add to 100% because of rounding or where multiple responses to a question are possible. The total number of participants to each question is shown either as 'Base' or 'n=xxx' in the tables or charts. Where the base or 'n' is less than the total number of participants, this is because participants may be 'routed' past some questions if they are not applicable. The percentages reported are weighted percentages.



2. THE HOME AND NEIGHBOURHOOD

2.1 Length of stay in neighbourhood (Q3)

The majority of respondents said they had lived in their neighbourhood for a significant period of time, with just under half of respondents (45%) stating they had lived in their current neighbourhood for more than 10 years. Compared to the previous year, the proportion of respondents stating they have lived in their current neighbourhood for more than 10 years has fallen from 50% in 2015 to 45% in 2016.




Perhaps unsurprisingly, older respondents were the most likely to have lived in their neighbourhood for a greater period of time, with 83% of respondents aged 65 and over having lived in their neighbourhood for more than 10 years.

Significantly more respondents who lived in the Ferry (66%) had lived in their neighbourhood for more than 10 years than respondents who lived in West End where 26% had lived in their neighbourhood for 10 years or more.

2.2 Best aspects of neighbourhood (Q1)

When asked, unprompted what they like best about living in their neighbourhood, the top two reasons as was the case in 2013, 2014 and 2015, were:

- Quiet and peaceful (45%)
- Neighbours (28%)



Analysis by age shows that:

- Those aged 16-34 were the least likely to state the best thing about living in their neighbourhood was that it was **quiet and peaceful** (36%). Respondents aged 65 and over were the most likely (55%).
- The proportion of respondents stating **neighbours** as the best thing about their neighbourhood increased with age, i.e. 18% of participants aged 16-34 compared to 29% of those aged 35-54, 31% aged 55-64 and 40% aged 65 and over.
- Younger respondents were the most likely to say the best thing about living in their neighbourhood was the **convenient location** (25%), those aged 65 and over were the least likely to say this (8%).
- The neighbourhood being **close to shops and amenities** was cited more by those aged 16-34 (19%) than those aged 65 and over (9%).

Analysis by tenure reveals that:

- Participants that own their own home (32%) or rent their home from a social landlord (32%) were the most likely to state **neighbours** as being the best thing about living in their neighbourhood than those who rent from a private landlord (11%).
- Respondents who rent their home from a social landlord were more likely to state their neighbourhood was **quiet or peaceful** (61%) than those who live in private rented accommodation (25%).

- More respondents who lived in private rented accommodation said the best thing about their neighbourhood was that it was a **convenient location** (37%). This is significantly higher than those who lived in housing rented from a registered social landlord (8%), or housing rented from the Council (10%).
- Being **close to shops and amenities** was cited by more respondents who rented their home from a private landlord (24%) than those who owned their own home (10%).


The biggest differences when analysed by ward were as follows:

- Respondents who lived in the West End (47%) were significantly more likely to state their neighbourhood was in a **convenient location**, than respondents who lived in Strathmartine (4%), Lochee (5%), The Ferry (6%) and the North East (6%).
- Significantly more respondents who lived in The Ferry (30%) commented that the area was a pleasant or nice area to live than those who lived in the West End (4%), Maryfield (8%) and Lochee (9%).
- Respondents who lived in the North East were more likely to state their neighbourhood was quiet or peaceful (67%), than those who lived in the West End (35%) and The Ferry (35%).
- Those who lived in the North East (47%) were more likely to cite neighbours as the best thing about their neighbourhood, than respondents who lived in the West End (15%) and Maryfield (19%).

Those who lived in the most deprived neighbourhoods were less likely to say the best thing about their neighbourhood was that it was a pleasant or nice area (7%) than residents who lived in other areas (17%).

2.3 Worst aspects of neighbourhood (Q2)

In terms of the worse aspects of the neighbourhood, the majority of participants stated that there was nothing that they did not like about their neighbourhood (75%) which is consistent with the findings from 2015 (75%). The most popular response given for those who were able to provide examples of what they disliked about their neighbourhood included, drug problems (6%), anti-social neighbours (4%) and difficult or poor parking (3%).




Participants living in the most deprived neighbourhoods were less likely to state there was nothing that they did not like about their area (73%) than respondents from all other areas (77%). Those who lived in the North East (84%) and The Ferry (80%) were the most likely to state that there was nothing that they did not like in their neighbourhood.

In terms of age, those aged 55-64 (77%) and 65 and over (78%) were more likely to state there was nothing that they did not like about their neighbourhood than respondents aged 16-34 (72%).

Analysis by tenure revealed that participants who owned their own home were more likely to state there was nothing that they did not like about their neighbourhood (82%) than respondents who rented their home from the Council (62%).

2.4 Change in the neighbourhood (Q4/5)

When asked about the change in the neighbourhood over the past 5 years, just under three quarters of participants (74%) were of the opinion that the neighbourhood has remained unchanged. On the other hand, just 2% of participants said the neighbourhood had improved and 6% said it had worsened.



Analysis by age revealed that participants aged 16-34 were significantly more likely to have answered don't know to this question (39%). On the other hand respondents aged 35-54 and 55-64 were the most likely to have said the neighbourhood has got worse (8%).

Those who lived in the most deprived areas were more likely to have said the neighbourhood has changed over the past 5 years. For example 10% of participants in the most deprived areas said their neighbourhood has improved or worsened compared to 6% of those from other areas. Furthermore, participants from the most deprived areas were more likely to state their neighbourhood has worsened (8%) than respondents from other areas (2%).


Those who lived in The Ferry (5%) and Strathmartine (5%) were the most likely to have said their neighbourhood has improved while East End (10%) and Coldside (9%) residents were the most likely to say their neighbourhood has worsened.

Analysis by tenure indicates that Council tenants were most likely to say their neighbourhood has got worse (15%).

Where participants believed their neighbourhood had improved, they were asked the main reasons for feeling this way. Care should be taken when reading these percentages due to the small number of participants who stated they believed their neighbourhood had improved. The main reasons given are displayed in the chart below and were:

- Quieter/ more peaceful (25%)
- Friendliness of people/ neighbours (19%)
- Better facilities/ amenities (16%)


The top two reasons for feeling the neighbourhood has improved have remained unchanged since the 2015 survey. However the proportion of respondents who felt improvements to the neighbourhood had been made as a result of better facilities/ amenities has increased from 5% in 2015 to 16% in 2016.



Those who stated the neighbourhood had worsened over the past 5 years were asked to explain why they felt this way. Care should be taken when reading these percentages due to the small number of participants who stated they believed their neighbourhood to have worsened. The main reasons given were:


- Drug problems (52%)
- Undesirable people moving in (19%)
- Anti-social behaviour/ neighbours (12%)

The problem of drugs has been the main problem for stating the neighbourhood has worsened since 2012.



2.5 Length of stay in house (Q7)


Turning now to the home, just over 4 in 10 participants (43%) had lived in their home for over 10 years. This is less than 2015, where 46% had lived in their home for more than 10 years.



Similar to length of stay in the neighbourhood, as age increases the length of stay in the current home also increases for example, 8% of respondents aged 16-34 had lived in their current home for 10 years or more compared to 83% of respondents aged 65 and over.


2.6 Tenure (Q8)

In relation to the tenure profile, just over half of participants (51%) were owner occupiers, 19% rented from a private landlord, 18% rented from the Council and 12% rented from a housing association. These figures are consistent with the 2015 survey.



2.7 Satisfaction with the home (Q9)

The vast majority of respondents (97%) said the general condition of their home was very or fairly good. The remaining 2% said their home was in average condition. The results are consistent with the findings from 2015, however the proportion of respondents stating their home is in very good condition has decreased from 57% to 52%.




The proportion of participants who were of the opinion that their home was in very good condition was highest amongst those who owned their property (71%) and was lowest amongst those who lived in a property rented from a registered social landlord (32%).

Participants who lived in The Ferry were the most likely to be of the opinion that the condition of their home is very good (98%). On the other hand those who lived in Lochee were the least likely to feel this way (26%).


3. LOCAL AREA AND SERVICES


3.1 Satisfaction with and ease of accessing local services (Q10/11)


In relation to local services and facilities, the proportion of respondents stating 'very satisfied' ranges from 65% in terms of sports and leisure facilities to 8% in terms of the Community Warden Service. Please note those who answered 'doesn't exist/ never used' have been removed from the analysis.



As shown in the charts below, the proportion of participants stating 'very satisfied' has generally decreased since the 2015 survey, with the exception of sports and leisure facilities, public transport, local youth facilities and community centre/library where the proportion of participants stating 'very satisfied' has increased. The most notable increase stating 'very satisfied' can be seen with regards to sports and leisure facilities which has increased by 16 percentage points from 49% in 2015 to 65% in 2016. On the other hand the most notable decrease can be seen in terms of the fire service where the proportion of participants stating very satisfied has decreased by 27 percentage points from 52% in 2015 to 25% in 2016.







Satisfaction with local services varied significantly by ward. The biggest variations stating 'very satisfied' were regarding:

- **Police Service**: Participants living in The Ferry (100%) were more likely to be very satisfied than those living in the West End (4%), Maryfield (10%) and Lochee (11%).
- **Fire Service:** 100% of participants from The Ferry stated they were very satisfied compared to 4% of respondents from the West End.
- **Refuse Collection:** Participants living in The Ferry were more likely to be very satisfied (99%) than respondents from the West End (4%), Lochee (9%) and Maryfield (11%).
- Employment and advice services: 91% of participants from The Ferry were very satisfied, compared to no respondents from the West End (0%) and 1% of respondents from Maryfield.
- **Public Transport:** Participants living in The Ferry (92%) were more likely to be very satisfied than those living in the North East (39%).
- **Sports and leisure facilities:** Participants living in The Ferry (99%) were more likely to be very satisfied than those living in the North East (27%).
- Community Centre/ Library: 98% of participants from The Ferry were very satisfied compared to 18% of respondents from the North East.
- Local Youth Facilities: Participants living in The Ferry were more likely to state they were very satisfied (96%) than respondents living in the North East (2%).
- Community Warden Service: 57% of participants from Coldside said they were very satisfied compared to no respondents from the West End (0%) or Maryfield (0%).

In terms of age, the biggest variations in those stating very satisfied were as follows:


- **Police Service:** Those aged 65 and over (35%) were more likely to state they were very satisfied than those aged 16-34 (20%).
- **Fire Service:** Younger respondents (those aged 16-34) were less likely to state they were very satisfied (19%) than those aged 65 and over (34%).
- **Refuse Collection:** Younger respondents (those aged 16-34) were less likely to state they were very satisfied (26%) than those aged 65 and over (43%).
- **Employment and advice services:** Participants aged 35-54 were more likely to be very satisfied (14%) than respondents aged 65 and over (8%).

- **Public Transport:** Participants aged 16-34 were more likely to be very satisfied (68%) than respondents aged 55-64 (57%).
- **Sports and leisure facilities:** Participants aged 16-34 (68%) and 35-54 (67%) were more likely to be very satisfied than participants aged 55-64 (59%) and 65 and over (59%).
- Community Centre/ Library: Participants aged 35-54 (66%) were more likely to be very satisfied than respondents aged 65 and over (58%).
- Local Youth Facilities: Those aged 35-54 were more likely to be very satisfied (44%) than those aged 65 and over (25%).
- Community Warden Service: Older participants (those aged 65 and over) were more likely to be very satisfied (15%) than those aged 35-54 (3%).

Analysis by tenure reveals the following:

- **Police Service:** 34% of respondents who owned their home were very satisfied, compared to 11% of respondents who rented their home from a registered social landlord.
- **Fire Service:** 33% of respondents who owned their home were very satisfied, compared to 11% of respondents who rented their home from a registered social landlord.
- **Refuse Collection:** 38% of respondents who owned their home were very satisfied, compared to 21% of respondents who rented their home from a registered social landlord.
- Employment and advice services: Participants who rented their home from the Council were more likely to be very satisfied (15%) than those who rented their home from a registered social landlord.
- **Public Transport:** 80% of respondents who rented their home from a private landlord were very satisfied, compared to 58% of respondents who owned their own home.
- Sports and leisure facilities: 77% of respondents who rented their home from a private landlord were very satisfied, compared to 49% of respondents who rented their home from a registered social landlord.
- Community Centre/ Library: 73% of respondents who rented their home from a private landlord were very satisfied, compared to 50% who rented their home from a registered social landlord.
- Local Youth Facilities: Participants who rented their home from the Council were more likely to be very satisfied (56%) than respondents who owned their own home (28%) or rented their home from a registered social landlord (29%).
- Community Warden Service: 22% of respondents who rented their home from the Council were very satisfied, compared to no respondents who rented their home from a private landlord (0%).

In relation to accessibility, participants were asked how easy it was to access a range of local facilities and services. Please note those who stated that they did not use a service or where a service was not available these respondents have been removed from analysis. As shown in the table below, respondents were most likely to consider, public transport (59% stating very easy), sports and leisure facilities (45%) and local youth facilities (42%) to be very easy to access. On the other hand the proportion of respondents stating these services or facilities was very easy to access was lower in relation to, the Community Warden Service (19%) and employment and advice services (22%).



As shown in the charts below, the proportion of participants stating 'very easy' has generally decreased since the 2015 survey, with the exception of sports and leisure facilities, public transport and local youth facilities where the proportion of participants stating 'very easy' has increased. The most notable increase stating 'very easy' can be seen with regards to public transport which has increased by 7 percentage points from 52% in 2015 to 59% in 2016. On the other hand the most notable decrease can be seen in terms of the Community Warden Service where the proportion of participants stating very easy has decreased by 25 percentage points from 43% in 2015 to 19% in 2016.



3.2 Satisfaction with aspects of the neighbourhood (Q12)


Following on from this respondents were then asked how satisfied or dissatisfied they were with various aspects of their neighbourhood. Please note the proportion of respondents answering 'don't know' to any of these options has been excluded from the analysis. The proportion of respondents stating 'very satisfied' was highest in terms of:


- Shopping facilities (60% stating very satisfied)
- The natural environment (43%)
- The built environment (39%).



In terms of overall satisfaction, the results in general do not vary significantly compared to the 2015 survey. However, overall satisfaction has decreased in terms of the condition of roads, pavements and street lighting (decreased from 81% in 2015 to 73% in 2016) and children's play areas (decreased from 92% to 87%).

As shown in the charts below, the proportion of participants stating 'very satisfied' has generally increased or remained consistent since the 2015 survey, with the exception of quality and maintenance of open spaces and the cleanliness of the area surrounding your home where the proportion of participants stating 'very satisfied' has decreased. The most notable decrease in the proportion of respondents stating very satisfied can be seen in terms of the quality and maintenance of open spaces where the proportion of respondents stating very satisfied has decreased by 5 percentage points.






NB Overall satisfaction with children's play areas in 2015 equates to 92%, not 93% due to rounding.

Analysis by area shows that the proportion of respondents stating very satisfied varies most in terms of:

- Cleanliness of the streets: Participants living in The Ferry (89%) were more likely to be very satisfied than respondents living in the West End (10%) and Lochee (10%).
- **Shopping facilities**: Participants living in The Ferry (90%) were more likely to be very satisfied than respondents living in the North East (31%).
- Condition of roads, pavements and street lighting: Participants living in The Ferry were more likely to be very satisfied (67%) than respondents living in the West End (2%), Maryfield (5%), the North East (6%) and Lochee (7%).
- Quality and maintenance of open spaces: Participants living in The Ferry were more likely to be very satisfied (89%) than respondents living in Maryfield (5%).
- Cleanliness of the area surrounding your home: Participants living in The Ferry were more likely to be very satisfied (89%) than respondents living in Lochee (7%).
- **The built environment:** Participants living in The Ferry were more likely to be very satisfied (93%) than respondents living in Lochee (14%).
- The natural environment: Participants living in The Ferry were more likely to be very satisfied (93%) than respondents living in Lochee (16%).
- Areas for children to play outside: Participants living in The Ferry were more likely to be very satisfied (78%) than respondents living in Strathmartine (7%) and Lochee (9%).

3.3 Satisfaction with neighbourhood as a place to live (Q6)

Participants were then asked to rate how satisfied they were with their neighbourhood as a place to live. 95% of respondents said their neighbourhood was a very or fairly good place to live. This is marginally less than the 2015 survey where 97% of respondents felt their neighbourhood was a very or fairly good place to live.




Analysis by area revealed that participants who lived in The Ferry (100%) were the most satisfied with their neighbourhood. Those who lived in the East End were the least satisfied (91%).



Analysis by tenure revealed that respondents who rented their homes from the Council were less likely to rate their neighbourhood as a very or fairly good place to live (86%) than respondents who own their own home (99%) or rent from a private landlord (98%).

3.4 Neighbourhood quality of life (Q13)

In terms of quality of life, overall satisfaction is high with almost all participants stating they were very or fairly satisfied with their quality of life in their neighbourhood (98%), compared to 2% who were dissatisfied. Overall satisfaction with the quality of life in the neighbourhood has remained consistent with the 2015 survey results.




Analysis by area reveals that participants from The Ferry were most likely to be very satisfied with the quality of life in their neighbourhood (98%). On the other hand, Lochee residents were least likely to be very satisfied (46%).

3.5 Dundee quality of life (Q14)

Overall satisfaction with the quality of life in Dundee is high, with almost all respondents (98%) stating they were very or fairly satisfied. The proportion of respondents stating they were very satisfied has increased by 10 percentage points from 62% in 2015 to 72% in 2016.



3.6 Providing voluntary/ unpaid help (Q16/17)

Respondents were asked whether they had given up any time to help any clubs, charities, campaigns or organisations in the last 12 months. We often find that people forget about some of the things they have done because they only do them occasionally or wouldn't normally think of it as helping people or their community. For this reason, those who answered no to this question were shown a list of groups and organisations and were asked whether they had undertaken any work or given unpaid help to any of these. The volunteering figure was therefore taken using a combination of the responses given to these two questions.

Just over 1 in 10 respondents (12%) said they had undertaken some form of work or activity on a voluntary basis in the last 12 months. This is an increase on the 2015 survey where (8%). The level of volunteering was greatest within the following groups:

- Rented their home from a private landlord (17%)
- Lived in The Ferry (26%)

Conversely, the incidence of volunteering was lowest in the following groups:

- Rented their home from the Council (6%) or a registered social landlord (6%)
- Lived in the Strathmartine (6%), Lochee (6%), the North East (8%) or Maryfield (7%)

3.7 Community activities (Q15)

Participants to the survey were read out a list of activities and asked which of these they were aware of. Awareness was highest regarding organised sporting activities (58%), organised social or leisure activities (46%) and community festivals or events (24%). Just over 3 in 4 respondents (76%) said they were aware of at least one activity. The number of respondents aware of after school and children's clubs has decreased significantly since the 2015 survey, from 37% to 16%. On the other hand the proportion of respondents aware of organised sporting activities has increased from 48% to 58%.

Following on from this, participants were asked how often they or a member of their household had taken part in each of these activities. The table below shows the proportion of participants who said they or a household member takes part in these activities on a daily or weekly basis. The most popular activities were organising sporting activities (66%), organised social or leisure activities (51%) and Community Council or Neighbourhood Groups. The proportion of respondents who said they or someone in their household attended an after school or children's club has decreased significantly since the 2015 survey, decreasing from 58% to 20%.

3.8 Cultural activities and events (Q18)

Participants were shown a list of cultural activities and events such as films, exhibitions, plays, museums and classes and asked whether they had taken part in or visited any of these activities in Dundee in the last 12 months. The vast majority of participants (84%) said they had taken part in or visited at least one of these activities or events in the last 12 months. This has increased slightly since the 2015 survey where 81% of respondents said they had taken part or visited any of these activities or events. The most popular activities were visiting the cinema (53%), and visiting the library (41%). Those who were most likely to have attended these events were:

- Aged 16-34 (95%)
- Had children in their household (92%)
- Rented their home from a private landlord (95%)
- Lived in the West End (95%)

Those who were least likely to have participated in cultural events or activities were:

- Aged 65 and over (62%)
- Had no children in their household (82%)
- Rented their home from a registered social landlord (72%)
- Lived in Strathmartine (77%)


3.9 Reasons for not taking part in community activities, organisations or events (Q19)

Those who had not taken part in any community activities or organisations were asked to provide reasons why this was the case. Just over 6 in 10 respondents (62%) said they did not take part in any activities or organisations as they were simply not interested, 21% said their health was not good enough and 10% of respondents said it never occurred to them. The proportion of respondents stating they did not participate as they were simply not interested has increased since the 2015 survey, increasing from 55% to 62%.


3.10 Influencing decisions (Q20a/b)

Participants were asked the extent to which they felt they had an influence over decisions which affect their neighbourhood. Please note those who answered don't know to these questions have been excluded from the analysis. Just under 4 in 10 respondents (37%) agreed that they could influence decisions that affect their local area compared to 25% who disagreed and 37% who neither agreed nor disagreed. The overall level of agreement for this question has decreased marginally since the 2015 survey from 40% in 2015 to 37% in 2016. The proportion of respondents who disagreed has decreased significantly from 37% in 2015 to 25% in 2016, subsequently the proportion of respondents who neither agreed nor disagreed has increased from 23% to 37%.



Those who lived in The Ferry were significantly more likely to agree that they can influence decisions (53%) than participants who lived in Maryfield (26%).


Just over 4 in 10 respondents (41%) were in agreement that people in their local community can influence decisions affecting the local area compared to 23% who disagreed and 36% who neither agreed nor disagreed. The proportion of respondents who agreed with this statement has decreased since the 2015 survey, decreasing from 50% to 41%. The proportion of respondents who neither agreed nor disagreed with this statement has increased significantly since the 2015 survey increasing from 23% to 36%.



4. HEALTH


4.1 Registered with GP or health centre/ dentist (Q21)


All respondents said they were registered with a GP or health centre. Fewer respondents (94%) were registered with a dentist. The proportion of respondents registered with a dentist is consistent with the 2015 survey.



4.2 Rating of health overall (Q22)

84% of respondents rated their health very or fairly good, compared to 9% who said it was fair and 7% who said it was very or fairly poor. The proportion of respondents who said their health was very or fairly good has remained consistent with the 2015 survey results, however the proportion of participants stating their health was very good has increased significantly since the 2015 survey, increasing from 45% to 60%.






As shown below, participants rating of health decreases dramatically as age increases.


Analysis by ward reveals that those who lived in Strathmartine were least likely to have rated their health as good or very good (75%) and those who lived in the West End (95%) were the most likely.

4.3 Moderate physical activity (Q23)

Just under 4 in 10 participants (36%) undertook moderate physical exercise for at least 30 minutes in a day, 4 days a week or more. 44% said they undertook moderate exercise 1-3 days per week, 10% said less than once a week and 11% of respondents said they never take part in moderate physical activity. The proportion of respondents stating they never take part in moderate physical activity has remained consistent with the 2015 survey results.




Similar to health, as age increases the proportion of participants undertaking moderate physical activity for at least 30 minutes for 4 days a week or more decreases. Younger respondents are more likely to be active for 4 days a week or more (77% of those aged 16-24) than older respondents (11% of those aged 65-74).



Respondents living in the most deprived areas were more likely to exercise at least once a week (89%) than respondents living in all other areas (72%).

4.4 Smoking habit (Q24)

Just over 1 in 4 respondents (26%) said they currently smoke, 21% said they used to smoke and 53% of respondents said they have never smoked. The results are consistent with the 2015 survey.




Those who lived in the most deprived areas (32%) were more likely to currently smoke than respondents from other areas (22%). Furthermore participants living in the East End (33%),

Strathmartine (30%) and Lochee (30%) were the most likely to smoke, whereas those living in The Ferry were least likely (18%).

Analysis by age reveals that respondents aged 35-54 (31%) were more likely to currently smoke than respondents aged 65 and over (10%). Males were more likely to smoke (36%) than females (17%).

4.5 Alcohol consumption (Q25)

Participants were asked about their alcohol consumption. Only 8% of respondents said they drink the recommended alcohol allowance (8 units for men/ 6 for women) or more at least once a week. On the other hand, 56% of respondents said they never drink the recommended alcohol allowance. The proportion of participants stating they never drink the recommended alcohol allowance has increased significantly since the 2015 survey increasing from 36% to 56%.



Analysis by age revealed that respondents aged 65 and over were the most likely to never drink the recommended alcohol allowance (79%), while respondents aged 16-34 were the least likely to say this (45%). Furthermore, females were more likely to have said they do not drink over the recommended allowance (66%) than males (46%).

Those who live in the most deprived areas were more likely to never drink the recommended alcohol allowance (72%) than all other respondents (44%).

Lochee respondents were most likely to consume more than the recommended alcohol allowance at least once a week (16%), while those who lived in the North East were most likely to have said they never consume more than the recommended allowance (73%).

4.6 Statements about mental wellbeing (Q26)

The Warwick-Edinburgh Mental Well-being Scale (WEMWBS) was developed by researchers at the Universities of Warwick and Edinburgh to enable the measurement of mental wellbeing of adults in the UK.

WEMWBS is a 14 item scale of mental well-being covering subjective well-being and psychological functioning, in which all items are worded positively and address aspects of positive mental health. The question used is shown below:





The scale is scored by summing responses to each item answered on a 1 to 5 Likert scale. The minimum scale score is 14 (if each of the items is scored 1 'none of the time') and the maximum score is 70 (if each of the items is scored 5 'all of the time').


For Dundee as a whole, the mean score for WEMWBS is 54.3. The mean score for Dundee in 2015 was 53.3, in 2014 it was 56.8 and in 2013 it was 57.1. The chart below shows the mean WEMWBS scores for each ward. This reveals that participants living in The Ferry (59.8) and the West End (55) had a higher than average WEMWBS score while participants living in Maryfield (53.8), Coldside (53.6), Lochee (51.8), the North East (53) and Strathmartine (52.9) had a lower than average WEMWBS score.




Analysis by age indicates that in general, the WEMWBS score decreases with age from 55 for respondents aged 16 to 24 to 51.2 for those aged 75 and over.




The chart below shows the mean WEMWBS score analysed by the participant's self-assessment of their own health. Those who said their health was very good had a significantly higher score (56) than those who rated their health very poor (42.8).



With regards to financial management, those who said they were managing very well financially had a higher WEMWBS score (54.5) than participants who said they didn't manage very well (45.4).




The chart below shows that respondents who strongly agreed that they could turn to friends or relatives in the neighbourhood for support had a higher WEMWBS score (55.2) than respondents who strongly disagreed with this statement (40.8).



4.7 Being treated fairly (Q27)


The survey asked participants to rate the extent to which they felt that people treated them unfairly where 1 was not at all and 6 was a great deal. 86% of respondents answered not at all to this question, which is a significantly increase since the 2015 survey where 64% of respondents held this opinion. The mean score for those who gave an opinion (i.e. excluding those who said 'don't know') was 1.24.



Analysis by age revealed that the mean score was lower for participants aged 16-34 (1.20) than those aged 35-54 and 65 and over (1.29). Furthermore, those who lived in the most deprived areas had lower scores (1.11) than respondents who lived in all other areas (1.35). Analysis by ward reveals that those who lived in The Ferry had the highest scores (1.85), while respondents who lived in the North East had the lowest score (1.05).

4.8 Support network (Q28)

95% of participants agreed that they could turn to friends and family for support, compared to 1% who disagreed and 4% who answered don't know. The proportion of respondents who said they strongly agreed with this statement has increased significantly since the 2015 survey increasing from 47% to 75%.




Females were significantly more likely to agree with this statement (80%) than males (69%). Furthermore, analysis by age revealed that respondents aged 35-54 were the most likely to strongly agree that they could turn to friends and relatives in the neighbourhood for support (78%). Respondents aged 65 and over on the other hand were the least likely (71%).

Respondents from the most deprived areas were more likely to strongly agree with this statement (85%) than respondents from all other areas (67%). Analysis by ward reveals that those who lived in Maryfield and the North East (92%) were the most likely to strongly agree with this statement. On the other hand, respondents residing in Coldside were the least likely (47%).


5. EDUCATION

5.1 Currently undertaking education or training (Q29)

9% of participants said they were currently taking part in some form of education or class which is slightly less than the 2015 survey results (12%) with the most popular form of education being a university based course.



The results to this question have not varied significantly when compared to previous years.




Perhaps unsurprisingly, younger respondents aged 16 to 34 were most likely to be taking part in some form of education or training (23%), while those aged 65 and over were least likely (0.2%).

Analysis by tenure reveals that those who lived in private rented accommodation were significantly more likely than all other participants to be in some form of education or training (37%).

Those who lived in the most deprived areas were significantly less likely to be in education or training (4%) than participants who lived in all other areas (14%). Furthermore, analysis by ward revealed that those who lived in the West End were most likely to be in education or training (31%), while those who lived in the North East (1%), the East End (3%), The Ferry (4%) and Strathmartine (4%) were least likely.

5.2 Type of qualification (Q30)

Those who said they were undertaking some form of training were asked to specify the type of qualification this would lead to. Only 1% said that this would not lead to a qualification, 82% said this would lead to a qualification at degree level or above and 16% said it would lead to another qualification. Compared to 2015, the proportion of those stating their training would lead to a degree level or above qualification has increased significantly increasing from 61% to 82%.




Younger participants aged 16 to 34 were the most likely to have said that the training will lead to a qualification at degree level or above (86%). Of the two respondents aged 55-64, one said their training would lead to a qualification at degree level or above and the other said it would lead to another qualification. The one respondent aged 65 and over said that the training they were undertaking would lead to another qualification.

6. COMMUNITY SAFETY

6.1 Safety in the neighbourhood (Q31)

Almost all participants (99%) said their neighbourhood was a very or fairly safe place to live, compared to 1% who said it was a bit unsafe. The results are consistent with the 2015 survey where 99% of respondents said their neighbourhood was very or fairly safe.




Respondents who lived in the most deprived areas were less likely to say their neighbourhood was a very safe place to live (73%) than all other respondents (85%). Analysis by ward indicates that those who lived in The Ferry (93%) were most likely to feel very safe. On the other hand participants who lived in the East End were least likely to feel this way (69%).

6.2 Safety during the day and at night (Q32)

Participants were asked how safe they felt in different circumstances:


- 89% felt very safe when walking alone in their neighbourhood during the day (86% in 2015).
- 94% felt very safe alone in their home during the day (94% in 2015).
- 50% felt very safe when walking alone in their neighbourhood after dark (46% in 2015)
- 92% felt very safe alone in their home at night (94% in 2015).





6.3 Change in the level of crime (Q33/34)

When asked about the changes in crime levels over the past year, the vast majority (68%) were of the opinion that the level of crime had remained the same over the past year, which is slightly lower than the results reported in 2015 (70%). On the other hand, 4% of respondents said there had been an increase in the level of crime (3% in 2015) and 0% said the level of crime had decreased (3% in 2014).



Analysis by ward is displayed in the table below:



Those who said that the level of crime in their neighbourhood had increased were asked about the factors which have influenced their opinion. The main factor which appears to have influenced opinion is word of mouth with 71% of participants stating that talking to people in their area has been the biggest influence on their opinion. This was also the most common answer given in 2014 and 2015.

6.4 Factors which contribute to crime level (Q35)

Participants were asked what they identified as being the main factor which contributes most to the level of crime in the neighbourhood. The most popular responses to this question were alcohol and/ or drugs (37%) and lack of money/ poverty (2%). Alcohol and drugs was also the most common response in previous years.

Just under 4 in 10 respondents (37%) were unable to answer this question, 9% said nothing contributes to the level of crime in their neighbourhood and 16% said they lived in a good neighbourhood where they do not have a lot of trouble.

6.5 Main issues for children/ young people (Q36)

Participants were then asked what in their opinion the main issues are for children and young people in their area. The most popular responses to this question were:


- Alcohol/ drugs (20%)

6.6 Extent to which fear of crime prevents them from taking part in everyday activities (Q37)

The vast majority (90%) of respondents said that the fear of crime does not prevent them at all from taking part in everyday activities. 9% said it prevents them a little, and 1% said it prevented them quite a lot or a great deal. The results are consistent with the 2015 results.



Analysis by ward indicates that those who live in Lochee (80%) were least likely to say that the fear of crime does not prevent them at all from taking part in everyday activities, than those living in The Ferry (100%).


Participants who owned their own home (93%) were more likely to have said the fear of crime does not prevent them at all than those who rented their home from the Council (84%).

Those who lived in the most deprived areas (86%) were less likely to say the fear of crime does not affect them at all than respondents from other areas (93%).

7. MONEY MATTERS


7.1 Bank or building society account and Contents Insurance (Q38/39)

The vast majority (98%) of participants had a bank account, 11% had a building society account and 1% had a post office card account. The proportion of respondents with bank accounts has remained consistent with the 2015 results.




Analysis by ward reveals that respondents from Lochee were the least likely to have a bank account (95%).

Just over 7 in 10 respondents said they had contents insurance (72%). This has decreased since the 2015 results from 78% to 72%.



7.2 Total value of savings (Q40)

Participants were asked about any savings or investments that they had. 19% of participants said they had investments or savings. The proportion of respondents who had savings or investments has decreased significantly from 31% in 2015 to 19%. Significantly more respondents did said they preferred not to give this information than previous years.




Younger participants were more likely to have no savings (44%) and those aged 65 and over were less likely (7%).

Perhaps unsurprisingly, those who owned their home (27%) were more likely to have savings than those who rented their home from the Council (10%).

Participants who lived in the most deprived areas were less likely to have savings (18%) than participants who lived in other areas (21%). Analysis by ward reveals that participants who lived in Coldside (34%) were most likely to have savings while those who lived in The Ferry (8%) and the North East (9%) were least likely. Those who lived in the Ferry (78%) and in the North East (80%) were most likely to have refused to answer this question.

7.3 Financial difficulties (Q41)

Just under 8 in 10 respondents (79%) said they were not experiencing any financial difficulty, 15% said they were experiencing difficulty with the cost of domestic energy bills and 6% were struggling to afford the cost of food. The results show that Dundee residents are less likely to be experiencing financial difficulties than in previous years, for example the proportion of respondents who are not having difficulty with any of these issues has continued to increase since 2013.



Analysis by age reveals that in general, those aged 65 and over were least likely to be experiencing financial difficulties with the following issues while younger respondents aged 16 to 34 were most likely. For example,

- Cost of food: 14% of respondents aged 16-34 said they were experiencing difficulty affording this compared to 1% of respondents aged 65 and over.
- Cost of domestic energy bills: 26% of respondents aged 16-34 said they were experiencing difficulty affording this compared to 6% of respondents aged 65 and over.


Analysis of the most deprived areas reveals that they too are more likely to be struggling to afford domestic energy bills:

Cost of domestic energy bills: 18% of respondents living in the most deprived areas said they were experiencing difficulty affording this compared to 12% of respondents living in all other areas.

It is interesting to note that respondents for other areas were more likely to state that they are struggling to afford the cost of food (7%) than respondents from the most deprived areas (5%).

7.4 Financial management (Q42)

The survey asked the extent to which participants were managing financially. Just over 6 in 10 respondents (63%) said they were managing very or quite well, 34% said they get by all right and 2% said they were not managing very well. The proportion of respondents who said their household is managing very or quite well has increased since the 2015 survey (56%).



Participants aged 55-64 were the most likely to state they were managing very or quite well financially (83%). Younger respondents on the other hand were the least likely to state they were managing very or quite well financially (43%).

Those who owned their own home were more likely to be managing very or quite well financially (85%) than respondents who rent their home from the Council (39%) or rent their home from a private landlord (40%).

Analysis by ward indicates that respondents living in The Ferry were most likely to state they were managing very or quite well financially (77%). On the other hand respondents living in Lochee were least likely (53%).

8. CONTACTING YOUR COUNCIL

8.1 Reason for contact (Q43)

45% of respondents said they had contacted the Council in the last 12 months. This is consistent with the 2015 survey. Of those who made contact, 4% had contacted to make a complaint, 37% were looking for information, and 59% were requesting a service.


8.2 Method of contact (Q47)

The majority of respondents (88%) contacted the Council by telephone. This was also the most popular method in 2013, 2014 and 2015, with the proportion of respondents contacting the Council by telephone increasing significantly from 2015 (79%). The proportion of participants who have made personal visits to the Council's office has decreased from 9% in 2015 to 3% in 2016.


8.3 Satisfaction with responding to complaints (Q44)

Those who contacted the Council to make a complaint were asked how satisfied they were that the Council responded to their complaint. More respondents were satisfied (67%) than dissatisfied (20%) with the Council in this respect. The proportion of respondents who were satisfied has decreased slightly since the 2015 survey where 70% of respondents were satisfied in this respect.




8.4 Satisfaction with responding to information requests (Q45)

Those who contacted the Council looking for information were asked how satisfied they were with the response that they received. 97% said they were very satisfied or satisfied with this contact to seek information compared to 2% who were dissatisfied. Overall satisfaction has seen an increase from 89% in 2015 to 97% in 2016. The proportion of respondents stating they were very satisfied with their contact to seek information has increased significantly, increasing from 26% to 79%.



8.5 Satisfaction with responding to service requests (Q46)

Those who contacted the Council to request a service were asked how satisfied they were with this contact. 97% said they were very satisfied or satisfied with the contact to receive a service compared to 1% who were dissatisfied. Overall satisfaction has remained consistent with the 2015 survey, however the proportion of respondents stating they were very satisfied has increased significantly since the 2015 survey, increasing from 54% to 74%.



8.6 Experience of contacting the Council (Q47)

More than nine in ten participants said they got what they needed when they contacted the Council (94%). This is slightly more than the 2015 survey where 91% said they got what they needed on the most recent occasion.

Analysis by contact method revealed that those who contacted the Council visiting their website (100%), by email (95%) and by telephone (94%) were most likely to say they got what they needed on the most recent contact. On the other hand, 40% of participants who contacted the Council by visiting their office and 12% who said they contacted the Council by letter said they had to contact the Council about the same issue again. Please note the base numbers for some of the contact types are very low, in particular contact by letter and by email.

8.7 Satisfaction with telephone contact (Q49)

8.8 Satisfaction with office contact (Q50)

Satisfaction with office visits was high with 100% satisfaction in terms of how easy it was to get to the office and the suitability of the office. Satisfaction was lowest in terms of the outcome of the contact (72%), this indicator has seen a decrease from the 2015 survey where 78% were satisfied. The suitability of the office has seen an increase in satisfaction from 87% in 2015 to 100% in 2016.



Analysis by age reveals that the proportion of participants who had any internet access decreases with age, for example from 97% of those aged 16-24 to 20% of those aged 75 and over.



In terms of geography, participants who lived in the West End were the most likely to have access to and use the internet (91%) and those who lived in the East End were the least likely (75%).

8.13 Vulnerable Adults (Q56)

Participants were asked for their opinions on a couple of statements regarding vulnerable adults.30% were aware that the Council have procedures in place to respond to situations where vulnerable adults might be at risk of harm, which is less than what was reported in 2015 (35%). Just over eight in ten participants (83%) said they would know who to contact if they had concerns that a vulnerable adult was at risk of being abused, which is a significant increase since the 2015 results (57%). Just under 9 in 10 participants (88%) said they would know who to contact if they had concerns that a child was at risk of being abused.

Analysis by age reveals that participants aged 35-54 (37%) and aged 65 and over (38%) were the most likely to be aware of the Council's procedures in place to respond to situations where vulnerable adults might be at risk of harm. Respondents aged 35-54 were also the most likely to be aware of who to contact if they had concerns about a vulnerable adult was at risk of being abused (88%). Participants aged 35-54 and 55-64 were the most likely to be aware of who to contact if they had concerns that a child was at risk of being abused (93%).

Those who lived in accommodation rented from a private landlord were the least likely to be aware of the Council's procedures to respond to situations (15%). This group was also the least likely to know who to contact should they have any concerns about a vulnerable adult (73%) or about a child who they felt was at risk of being abused (79%). Council tenants were the most likely to be aware of the Councils procedures to respond to situations where vulnerable adults may be at risk of harm (39%) and they were the most likely to know who to contact if they have any concerns about a vulnerable adult (90%). Council tenants and those who owned their own home were also the most likely to know who to contact if they had concerns about a child they felt was at risk of being abused (90%).

9. VIEWS ABOUT THE COUNCIL

9.1 Statements about the Council - most important (Q57)

Participants were asked to select from a list of statements about their local council which three they considered most important. This revealed that the following were considered to be most important for survey participants:

- Offering a good range of services (69%)
- Providing services which are value for money (59%)
- Providing good quality services (47%).

In 2015, the most important service was providing an efficient service.

- Tackling important issues for the future of the area: was more important for respondents aged 16-34 (41%) than respondents aged 65 and over (30%).
- **Providing good quality services:** was more important for respondents aged 65 and over (51%) than respondents aged 16-34 (44%)
- Offering a good range of services: was more important for respondents aged 65 and over (72%) than respondents aged 55-64 (66%).

The main differences by tenure were:

- **Providing an efficient service:** Most important for those who own their own home (51%) and least important for those who rent their home from a private landlord (36%).
- Tackling important issues for the future of the area: Most important for those who rent their home from a registered social landlord (50%) and least important for those who rent their home from a private landlord (34%).
- Providing services which are value for money: Most important for those who rent their home from a private landlord (63%) and least important for those who rent their home from the Council (52%).
- Providing good quality services: Most important for those who rent their home from a private landlord (50%) and least important for those who rent their home from a registered social landlord (40%).

9.2 Agreement with statements about the Council (Q58)

Following on from this, participants were asked to state the extent to which they agreed or disagreed with various statements about the Council. Participants were most likely to agree with the following statements:

- Offers a good range of services (75%)
- Provides an efficient service (71%)
- Provides good quality services (67%)

The level of agreement with ensures sustainable use of resources and care for the environment has increased by 9 percentage points since the 2015 survey. As well as an increase in levels of agreement a number of statements have also seen a decrease since the 2015 survey. The largest decreases can be seen in terms of:

- Has friendly, polite, helpful, well informed employees (decreased by 10 percentage points)
- Communicates well with the public (decreased by 8 percentage points)

Participants aged 16 to 34 were the least likely to agree with all statements. On the other hand participants aged 55-64 were the most likely to agree with all the statements. The largest variations in satisfaction can be seen in terms of:

- **Provides an efficient service**: 59% of 16 to 34 year olds in agreement compared to 86% of those aged 55-64.
- Offers a good range of services: 64% of 16 to 34 year olds in agreement compared to 89% of those aged 55-64.

■ Tackles important issues for the future of the area: 48% of 16 to 34 year olds in agreement compared to 69% of those aged 55-64.

The results vary by those who lived in the most deprived areas. The biggest differences can be seen with regards to the following statements:

- Ensures sustainable use of resources and cares for the environment: 65% of respondents who live in the most deprived areas agreed with this statement compared to 55% of respondents who live in all other areas.
- Tackles important issues for the future of the area: 57% of respondents who lived in the most deprived areas agreed with this statement compared to 51% of respondents from all other areas.
- **Promotes its services well:** 56% of respondents who lived in the most deprived areas agreed with this statement compared to 48% of respondents from all other areas.

Participants who rented their home from the Council were the most likely to agree with all statements. The largest differences can be seen with regards to the following statements:

- Friendly, polite, helpful, well informed employees: The level of agreement ranged from 33% for those living in private rented accommodation to 81% for Council tenants.
- **Provides a good quality service:** The level of agreement ranged from 42% for those living in private rented accommodation to 81% for Council tenants.
- **Listens to complaints:** The level of agreement ranged from 29% for those living in private rented accommodation to 63% for Council tenants.

10. HOUSEHOLD DETAILS

10.1 Number of adults/ children (Q59)

The table below shows the number of children and adults in the household. 78% of households interviewed did not have any children under the age of 16. This has slightly increased since the 2015 survey where 73% of households had no children.


