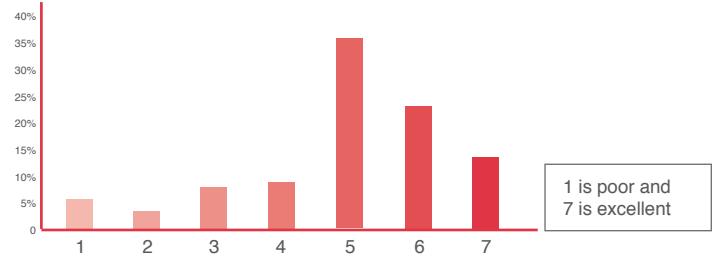

How you would rate the quality of Community Living where you live?



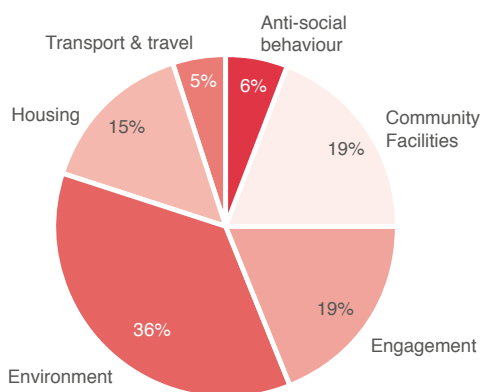
Do you agree with these statements about Community Living in your area?

More space to socialise on the street, slower (and less!) traffic, more green space, benches, space to safely cycle, less litter, a more vibrant local high street.

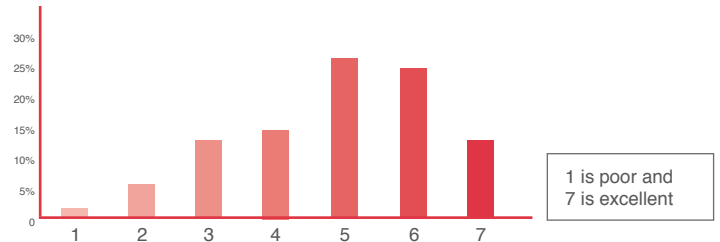
More regular police on local roads to stop high speed drivers and bikers on roads and scooters on pavements.

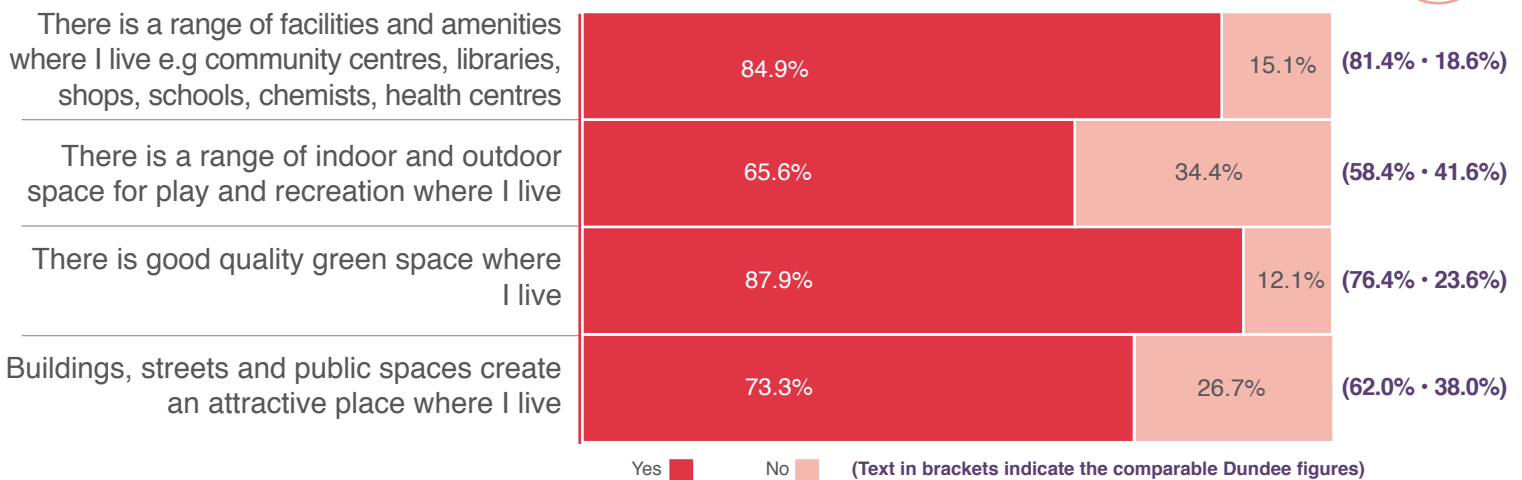

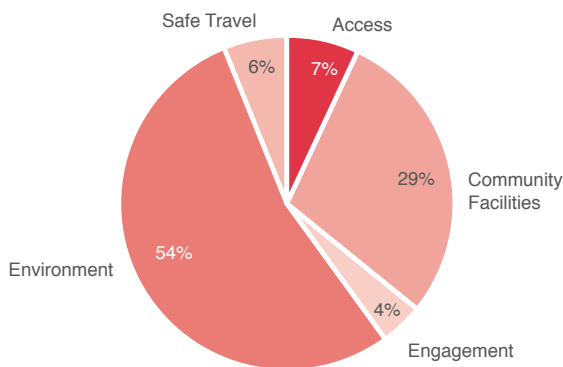
How you would rate the quality of Community Spaces where you live?

A community space/centre which can be hired or activities such as yoga and art classes would be really useful - we don't have a community centre in this area.

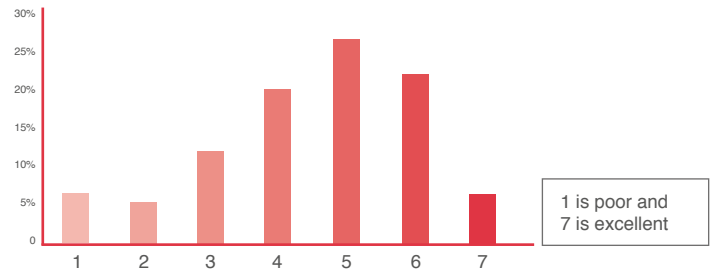
Better upkeep of green areas litter clearing etc. It is impossible for residents and their children to use the grassed areas around the Polepark Road masonettes due to dog fouling.

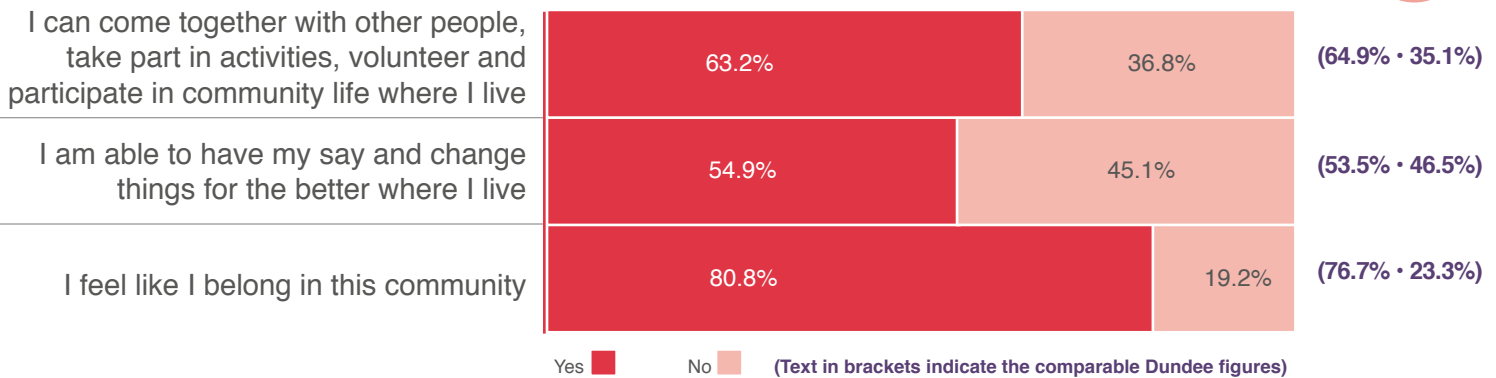

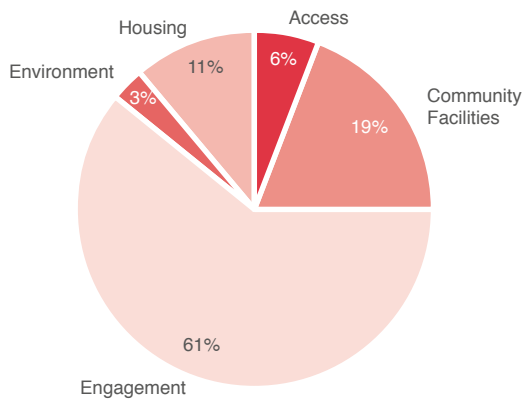
How you would rate the quality of Community Spirit where you live?

Effective communication about local events, organisations, activities, etc. Need to create focus to foster community relationships and activities.

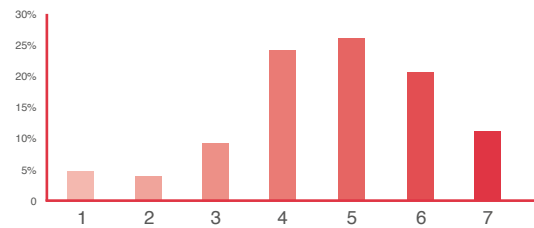
More community events to add to the cohesion that has formed during the pandemic.

1 is poor and 7 is excellent

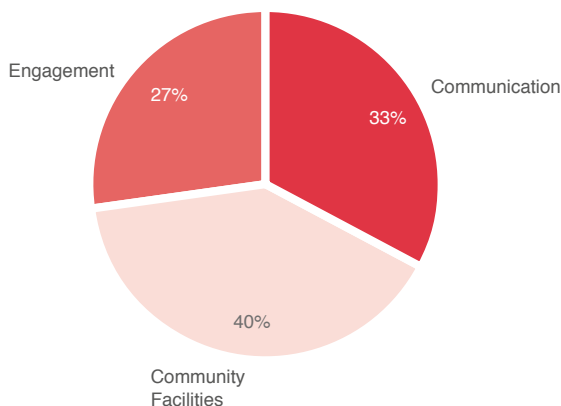

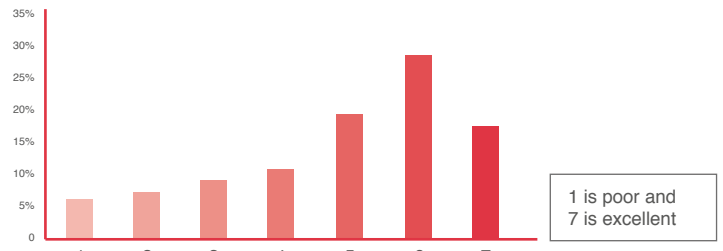

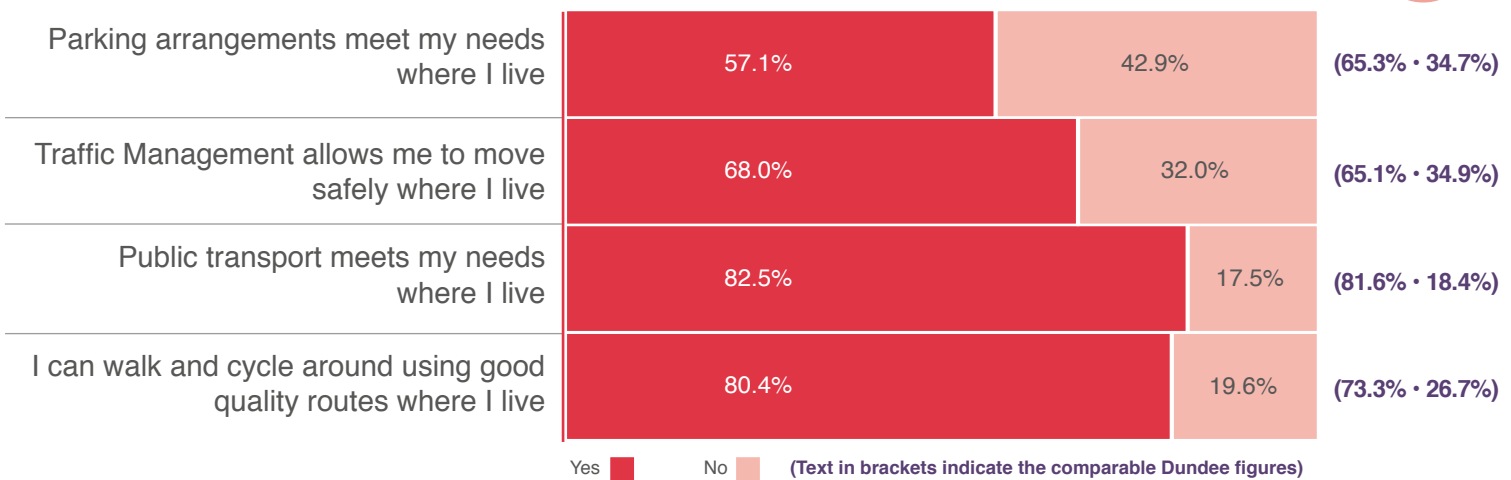

How you would rate the quality of Community Travel where you live?



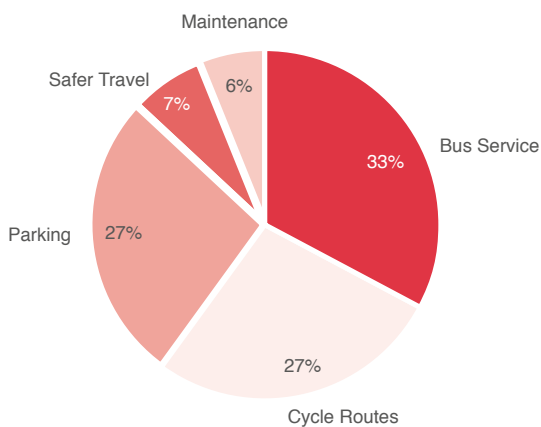
Do you agree with these statements about Community Travel in your area?
