1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

To update the Committee on Dundee being successful in getting to the 2nd stage of the National Performance Centre for Sport bidding process.

2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Committee is recommended to:

- 2.1 note that Dundee will progress with its Stage 2 Bid submission for the National Performance Centre for Sport under the direction of the Steering Group.
- 2.2 acknowledge the input to date of the steering group partners and their future commitment to the bid process
- 2.3 approve the continued appointment of Knight Kavanagh and Paige (KKP) as Economic Consultants for Dundee's bid for the National Performance Centre for Sport and their associated specialist sub consultant appointments.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 Funding of up to 50% of the reasonable eligible costs is to be provided by the Scottish Government via **sport**scotland. The amount will be dependent on the agreed level of work to be submitted at Stage 2.
- 3.2 The estimated total cost of external consultants is £150,000. The balance after the Scottish Government's contribution of 50% would be £75,000 from the City Council. This can be met from the General Fund balances.
- 3.3 In house professional services will be provided for the Site Servicing and Infrastructure Works from the City Engineers and in kind support from all the bid Partners.

4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Reference is made to the Policy and Resources Committee of 28 February 2011 Agenda item IV National Football Academy in Dundee, where it was agreed that Dundee would submit a Bid and establish a Steering Group chaired by the Chief Executive.
- 4.2 Reference is made to the Policy and Resources Committee of 11 February 2013 article VI where it was agreed to utilise the South East Corner of Camperdown Country Park as the suggested location for the National Performance Centre for Sport as well as noting the submission of the 1st Stage Bid on the 15th February 2013.
- 4.3 Reference is also made to article XV of the Policy & Resources Committee of the 25th June 2012 where approval was given to the appointment of KKP as economic consultants after a tendering exercise, to assist in the submission of the City's Bid.
- 4.4 Dundee was informed on the 16th April 2013 that, on the approval of the Deputy First Minister with Ministerial responsibility for Infrastructure, it had been successful in going

forward to the 2nd stage of the bidding process for the National Performance Centre for Sport. Please see Appendix 1 for a copy of the letter from Stewart Regan, Chairman of the NPCS Steering Group. Stage 2 will require the City working with **sport**scotland to discuss actions to be addressed following the stage 1 application and the process to be followed through to the submission of the Stage 2 bid on the 5 July at 12:00. A series of meetings will be started as soon as possible with support by **sport**scotland throughout. An announcement on the preferred bidder will be made during the summer.

The two other bidders are Heriot Watt University with the City of Edinburgh Council and Stirling Council with Stirling University.

- 4.5 It is proposed that consultants KKP undertake the Stage 2 Economic Assessment of the National Performance Centre for Sport, both in regards to the revenue assumptions, operating model and business plan as well as providing specialist sub consultants' appointments. This would cover architectural and town planning services, engineering services in relation to the structures, sports surfacing, landscape architecture, costing, catering and hotel consultancies. This also includes promotional material created as part of the bid submission. The total cost of this is estimated at £150,000, 50% of which will be funded by the Scottish Government.
- 4.6 It is further proposed that in house services are provided by the City Engineers for all Site Servicing and Infrastructure Works.
- 4.7 It is proposed that the bid will be taken forward via the Steering Group established for the Stage 1 bid and chaired by the Chief Executive, which will continue to meet on a regular basis. The partnership approach is seen as a very strong element of Dundee's Bid to get the National Performance Centre for Sport. The committee is asked to acknowledge the contribution already made by all the members of the steering group partnership. These are the University of Dundee, University of Abertay, Dundee, Dundee College, Dundee FC, Dundee United FC, NHS Tayside and Leisure & Culture Dundee.
- 4.8 A report on the contents of the Stage 2 bid will be submitted to a special meeting of this committee on the 24th June 2013.

Following the lengthy and detailed assessment of your stage 1 bid proposals to host the National Performance Centre for Sport, I am pleased to inform you that the Deputy First Minister with ministerial responsibility for infrastructure has approved the recommendation of the Steering Group to invite you to take forward your bid to stage 2 of the process.

I have asked Mark Cowan and his team at **sport**scotland to contact you to arrange an early meeting to discuss actions to be addressed following stage 1 and the process to be followed through to the submission of stage 2 bids. Mark and his team will be available to provide support throughout this process. In addition to this practical support, I am delighted that Ministers have agreed to make available funding of up to 50% of reasonable, eligible costs incurred in developing your bid up to a maximum of £100,000. This figure will be dependent on the agreed level of work to be submitted at stage 2. **sport**scotland will be responsible for releasing this funding.

The Steering Group was grateful to you and your team for providing clarification on a number of issues which assisted us in our deliberations. As a result of the additional consultation in the process, it has been agreed that the deadline for submission of stage 2 bids will now be 12:00 on 5 July and I look forward to receiving your stage 2 bid on or before that date. An announcement on the preferred bidder remains on course to be made during the summer.

No formal announcement will be made but information on the outcome of stage 1 of the process has been made available on the Scottish Government and **sport**scotland websites.
