Areas for Improvement:

- Continue to support the parents' focus group, as it develops, to further improve communication with parents and carers
- Make more regular use of the whiteboard at the main entrance to inform parents of daily activities which the children had enjoyed
- Improve recording of accidents, including child's full name, date and both a staff and parent's signature
- Consider extending use of email to communicate with parents
- Collate, audit and feedback to parents a more formal summary of the responses to questionnaires to explain why some suggestions might not be taken on board and show how others had been used to improve the service
- Seek, and implement wherever possible, further opportunities for children and parents to influence the environment
- Keep the resources cupboard, or drawers within it, locked to ensure the safety of the children and safely store furniture and equipment when not in use
- Consider introducing more display tables at child height to encourage involvement

Recommendations

- All accidents and incidents should be fully recorded and parents given a signed copy with all relevant details. These should be regularly audited
- Children should be cared for within a safe environment
