1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report considers the requirement to promote a Traffic Regulation Order to facilitate the movement of traffic and provide a servicing area on a new section of carriageway which will join Aimer Square with Doyle Place.

- 1.2 This report considers the requirement to stop-up and remove from the list of public roads lengths of road, footpath, footway and grass verge in the Aimer Square and Doyle Place areas utilising the powers of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984.
- 1.3 This report also considers the necessity to convert a short section of carriageway into footway in the Aimer Square area utilising the powers of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984.

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee approve the preparation of the necessary Traffic Regulation Order to effect the changes of the traffic regulations on a new section of road joining Aimer Square to Doyle place which has the proposed name of St Ann Lane which will be added to the Dundee City Council (North Western Area, Dundee) (Waiting & Loading Restrictions) Order 2010. The lengths of road, footway, footpath and grass verge which are depicted on the attached plan will require to be stopped-up and removed from the List of Public Roads. The short length of road which is depicted on the attached plan will require to be converted from carriageway to footway.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The Director of Corporate Services has confirmed that the funding for the project is available from the City Development (Lochee Community Regeneration) Capital Budget..

4 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 To allow for the redevelopment of Lochee, it is necessary that the proposed Stopping-up Orders are made to remove sections of road, footpaths, footway and grass verge which will become unnecessary.
- 4.2 It will be necessary to convert a short section of existing carriageway currently known as Aimer Square into footway to provide a safe walking environment for pedestrians on the new section of carriageway to be provisionally known as St Ann Lane.
- 4.3 It will also be necessary to vary existing waiting restrictions which will facilitate the movement of traffic and provide a servicing area on a new section of carriageway which will join Aimer Square to Doyle Place.
