1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report brings to the attention of the Education Committee an allocation of £126,800 to Science Year and the Science Strategy for Scotland. The funding is ring fenced for science projects and targeted on resources and activities to support these projects. This report proposes a distribution of these funds to schools in Dundee City Council.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 The Education Committee is recommended to:
 - i) note the provision of £126,800 ring fenced for the development of science.

and

ii) approve the distribution of funds as set out in Appendix I.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 Dundee City Council has been given a Special Grant of £126,800 from the Scottish Executive. This additional funding is ring fenced to support science projects. SEED require that this funding be spent or distributed to schools in the current financial year. This funding will be distributed to schools as set out in Appendix I.

4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

4.1 In supporting the development of science education in schools this funding will help young people in Dundee to access to the skills, knowledge and information needed to enable everyone to play a full part in society.

6.0 REPORT

- 6.1 The Science Strategy for Scotland emphasises the importance of science education in schools in developing a culture that is comfortable with scientific thinking and which encourages young people to pursue science related subjects.
- 6.2 Dundee City Council would wish to endorse this view and to actively promote the development of science in our schools as a key element in providing young people in Dundee with the skills demanded by our developing high tech industries. In primary schools the current review of Environmental Studies has identified the need to provide additional equipment to support science and technology. In secondary schools there are continuing demands for equipment to meet the demands of revised curricula in S1/2 and for National Qualifications. This additional funding by the Scottish Executive will therefore complement the work currently going on in our schools to develop science and will give schools the opportunity to upgrade and widen the range of equipment and resources to support this work.
- 6.3 It is proposed that the funding be deployed to schools on a formula basis which will give all schools a base allocation plus a per capita allocation to take account of the numbers of pupils on the school roll. Appendix I gives details of the allocation to all schools. The funding is ring fenced (in accordance with SEED advice) for expenditure on science activities and resources.

7.0 CONCLUSIONS

7.1 This funding will give schools a valuable addition to their resources for science and will help take forward Dundee City Council current initiatives to develop science in schools.

8.0 CONSULTATION

8.1 The Director of Finance and the Director of Support Services and headteachers of city schools have been consulted in the preparation of this report.

9.0 BACKGROUND PAPERS

9.1 No background papers, as defined by Section 50D of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 (other than any containing confidential or exempt information) were relied on to any material extent in preparing the above report. The Scottish Executive require that this funding be spent or distributed to schools before the end of the current financial year. In view of the timescales involved and to allow schools to proceed quickly to deploy this funding this report was approved by the Director of Education in consultation with the Convener and Opposition Spokespersons.
