PROJECT INFORMATION	Transformation of underutilised space into an attractive therapeutic garden for DCC Homeless Reception Centre. The project will create an appropriate garden for food-growing, biodiversity and create a therapeutic environment to rear of the centre, with the aim of improving the mental health of residents and staff, providing a space for residents to acquire new skills. Planters, seating, a pond, fruit trees and bushes, a shelter and a picnic table will be installed.	In August 2021, Dundee was allocated £125,000 from Scottish Government to commence a programme of renewal of public play areas (0-14 years only) within the local authority area. It has been confirmed that the full allocation must be spent this financial year. Environment Service commenced a Play Audit in August 2021. The audit consists of surveying each play area for 0-14 years (excluding schools) in Dundee and considers the following:- Play area type, i.e. NEAP, LEAP or LAP Initial Impression, e.g. access, welcoming, open views, litter, vandalism Equipment types Health and Safety, e.g. condition of equipment, safe access, condition of site. Location, e.g. well used, proximity of schools and residential areas SIMD data zones

		The survey work is close to completion. Officers will then review all findings holistically and produce a report for further consideration at a future Neighbourhood Services Committee which indicates priorities for investment. Due to current lead in delivery timescales (approximately 20 weeks), the purchase of Core Item equipment via Direct Award from Scotland Excel Play Framework (Supply and Deliver) to the value of £125,000 is proposed. The equipment includes a selection of swings, slides, climbing nets and frames and inclusive roundabouts, The Play Audit findings will inform where the play equipment will be installed during 2022/23, subject to further approval of the Neighbourhood Services Committee. A further allocation for Dundee is expected from the remainder of the £55 milliof funding in future years. The extent of renewal and refurbishment will vary across the whole play estate and will be influenced by local plans and investment priorities and engagement with children and young people.
