1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

The Report outlines the Dundee City Council strategic local programme of social and affordable housing projects based on the Affordable Housing Supply Programme resource planning assumptions 2012/13 - 2014/15.

4.0 MAIN TEXT

Background

Scottish Government Housing Supply Division Guidance Note 2012/06 sets out new procedures for the operation of the Affordable Housing Supply Programme (AHSP). The process involves the Council working in partnership with housing associations to develop a Strategic Local Programme (SLP) of social and affordable housing projects. The programme will include projects for delivery over the next three years which meet housing need identified within the Strategic Housing Investment Programme (SHIP). The current Dundee City Council SHIP 2012-2015 was approved by Housing Committee in June 2012 (Committee Report 165-2012).

The AHSP is available to support registered social landlord (RSL) homes for social rent, intermediate rent, new supply shared equity and shared ownership as well as council social rented housing.

Resources

From 2012/13 to 2014/15 councils will receive three year resource planning assumptions. For Dundee City Council the allocation is £9.816M.

Priorities

The RSL carry forward projects are Ardler Site 6A being developed by Sanctuary Scotland Housing Association and Mill o Mains Phase 2 being developed by HOME. The council project is the Scottish Government grant for the Council new build development at Ann Street, Hilltown.

The SLP has been developed in accordance with the SHIP and in consultation with the Scottish Government and RSL partners. The priority projects for the new money of £4.365M available are set out in the SLP tables at Appendix 1. These are Mill o Mains Phase 3 (HOME) and Ormiston Crescent, Whitfield (Angus Housing Association).

5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This Report has been screened for any policy implications in respect of Sustainability, Strategic Environmental Assessment, Anti-Poverty, Equality Impact Assessment and Risk Management.
