1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek the Committee's approval for the Council to participate in a European Union funded project testing a European standard approach for Digital certificates.

6. THE PROJECT - ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES

- 6.1 Dundee City Council was invited to join this project on the strength of its involvement and experience in several national and international initiatives relating to electronic service delivery such as the smartcard and online transactions.
- 6.2 Local Authorities' desire to implement Electronic Service Delivery is limited by security and the difficulty of establishing the identity of remote parties with any confidence.

As a result, Service Providers often:

- only provide services face-to-face
- use low-security artefacts such as passbooks, vouchers, or manual signatures
- restrict remote services to low-risk, low-value "anonymous" services
- 6.3 In electronic service provision, Service Providers (and their Customers) must have confidence in the identity of the other party and the data sent in order to give an enforceable contract. There are many ways to achieve these and currently the most robust and reliable methods use techniques known generally as Asymmetric Digital Cryptography and Digital certificate/signature. This infrastructure can be made very secure and can allow service providers to deliver even sensitive or high-value services electronically with confidence.

6.4 SPES and W SPES

SPES (Setting Processes for Electronic Signatures) was an EU project, supported through eTEN (Electronic Trans-European Networks). Begun in Nov 2002, it aimed to develop the core technology and business processes to allow Digital Signatures to be used by Public Administration services in secure Electronic Service Delivery.

6.5 W-SPES (Widening SPES) aims to consolidate and extend the work done under SPES and to integrate other EU-funded projects in this field. New members were invited to join a core of

original SPES partners to apply the expertise developed during the initial project and to pilot real-life applications.

6.6 W-SPES involves 15 partners:

6.7 Dundee City Council has secured up to €193,000. The eTEN programme awards up to 10% of expenditure in the related field. In Dundee's case the investment in the Customer First strategy and Modernising Government Fund. The overall budget across all partners is €1,200,000. The Council's participation will be managed by the Dundee Discovery Card Team.

6.8 **Objectives**

The project will run until early 2008 and is divided into 6 Work Packages:

WP1 - Project Management & Administration

WP2 - Refining the SPES technology and components
WP3 - Selection of pilot applications by the partners

WP4 - Customisation of technology for each partner's applications

WP5 - Deployment to live services

WP6 - Collations and dissemination of results

Dundee City Council will be involved in WP3 onwards and would identify our pilot use of electronic signatures later this year
