1.0 PURPOSE

1.1 To authorise the purchase of two replacement light vehicles and one road suction sweeping machine.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 It is recommended that the committee accept the offers from the suppliers detailed below (as highlighted in the attached synopsis of tenders), which are the most advantageous to the Council.

3.1 The expenditure relating to the light vehicles (£13,580.70) can be met from the Waste Management Department's 2005/06 Capital Budget. The expenditure relating to the road suction sweeper (£73,884) is being met from Quality Of Life funding.

6.0 MAIN TEXT

- 6.1 The Waste Management Department requires to renew a number of vehicles which are beyond economic repair.
- 6.2 Dundee City Council went out to tender to seek the best and most cost effective vehicle replacement types for the road suction sweeping machine. Attached is a summary of the tender returns. The sweeping machine recommended is compatible with the existing fleet and has proven to be the most reliable type.
- 6.3 The type of vehicle required for supervisors use (light vans) are within the categories of the framework agreement which the City Council subscribed to in June 2005. Purchasing these vehicles from this source as opposed to supply from normal dealer networks has provided a saving of £549.28 each.
