#### 6. **BACKGROUND**

- 6.1 At its meeting on 20 October 2003, Committee approved the Council Plan 2003-2007. The Plan includes a number of strategic objectives, projects and commitments to best value reviews, and also includes a commitment to report progress on these.
- 6.2 Attached are tables which provide a concise summary of progress on each of the objectives and projects in the Plan. Since we are less than a year into a four-year Plan, a number of these have still to be developed but notable achievements to date include:
  - continuous improvement in attainment in almost all primary and secondary schools
  - Dundee Co-ordinated Anti-Crime Network now fully operational

- target for dealing with delayed discharges was exceeded
- 97 persistent young offenders identified through the Fast Track initiative and all provided with programmes to address their behaviour
- 21% recycling achieved, and planned investment will help achieve the Scottish Executive's target of 25% by 2006
- Council Tax and Housing Rents increase both kept within target
- learners receiving literacy support have more than doubled to 1,142 and venues have increased from 2 to 13
- all Business Gateway performance targets met in full
- water cooling facilities installed at all primary schools
- community wardens operational
- draft local community plans produced for further consultation
- 16 wards now covered by neighbourhood representative structures
- Yellow Flag status achieved for Broughty Ferry beach
- new Housing Repairs Service operational
- 6.3 A number of best value reviews have been commenced as agreed in the Plan but these are still in their early stages and a detailed review of progress with these will be included in next year's annual report.
