1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report advises Members of the current position in relation to fire risk assessments in Social Work properties.

6 MAIN TEXT

6.1 The local authority has responsibilities under Health and Safety legislation to ensure that fire safety measures are in place in all its buildings, for the protection of both service users and staff. As Social Work provides a 24-hour per day, 7 day per week service for some very vulnerable individuals, the importance of appropriate measures and procedures cannot be overestimated. This was highlighted by the recent tragic fire in a care home in Uddingston.

- 6.2 A programme of fire risk assessments of Social Work properties had already begun, but in the wake of the Uddingston incident, this programme was accelerated and existing assessments were reviewed and updated if required. Appropriately trained and experienced staff from Economic Development and Architectural Services undertook the risk assessments on behalf of Social Work. In addition, the Fire Service undertook independent visits to all care homes in Dundee as part of a nationwide programme.
- 6.3 Each risk assessment is very detailed. A summary of the outcome and action taken following completion of the risk assessments is attached as Appendix 1.
- 6.4 The vast majority of recommendations have already been actioned and those remaining are mostly in the lowest priority category. It is reassuring to note that the Fire Brigade had only minor recommendations to make in a few premises when they conducted their recent inspections. All of these recommendations have already been actioned
