# 1. **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1. To seek approval for the sale of land in Whitfield, Dundee, to Home in Scotland Ltd.
- 1.2. This report will contribute to the City Council's aim to "tackle poor living conditions which are unpopular within communities, and take action to help residents put the heart back into their communities and provide quality housing and choice".

# 2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

## 6. **BACKGROUND**

Reference is made to Article III of the minutes of the Housing Committee of 14<sup>th</sup> December 1998, when approval was given to demolish existing buildings known as 217-234 Carberry Crescent, Dundee, and the Director of Housing was remitted to bring forward proposals for redevelopment at the appropriate time. Discussions have taken place between the Housing Strategy Manager and Home in Scotland Ltd. who have recently taken over the operations of Vale of Duntrune Community Housing Association Ltd.. Home in Scotland, subject to planning permission, intend to provide five/six family houses including two specifically for disabled persons; these will complement existing housing in the area provided by VODCHA.
