1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 Seek authority to conduct a gas flow trial at Riverside.

2.1 It is recommended that the offer amounting to £20,700 from McKeighley Ltd be accepted. The Committee is asked to note that this is based upon price, the company has visited the site to evaluate the task and demonstrated that they have the experience to undertake the task.

6.0 BACKGROUND

- Dundee City Council is obliged to complete a proposal for the restoration of the Landfill Site in the form of a Closure and aftercare Plan which is submitted to The Scottish Environment Agency (SEPA), as the Regulator, for approval.
- As part of the Closure and Aftercare Plan, SEPA require the Council to address the emission of landfill gas from the site and revisit the subject of final cover on the site.
- 6.3 A gas flow trial will assess the potential for using, flaring or venting the gas. The information and recommendations supplied by the selected contractor will form that part of the Aftercare and Closure proposals.
- Four contractors were invited to tender for this specialist work. McKeighley and Organics visited the site and provided quotes for the full service. Entec provided a quote but did not visit the site. AFS offered to project manage this project but did not wish undertake the survey and recording tasks.

6.5 The bids were as follows:-

McKeighley £20,700 Organics £20,800 Entec £25,800 AFS no bid
