#### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to set out the 2016-17 payments to Third Sector groups from the Children and Families Service and to seek approval for the development and implementation of a joint Commissioning Strategy to inform future funding allocation.

#### 2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that members of the Policy and Resources Committee:

- · Agree the proposed allocation of payments; and
- Instruct the Executive Director of Children and Families to establish a joint Commissioning Strategy for implementation in the financial year 2017–2018.

#### 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The current allocation of Third Party payments within the Children and Families Service is £3.5 million pounds. The proposed allocation to Third Sector groups and organisations would result in revenue savings of 120k.

#### 4.0 MAIN TEXT

- 4.1 Dundee's Children & Families Service is committed to working with its partners to meet the needs, wishes and aspirations of children, young people, their families and their local communities. To do this effectively we need to work in partnership to identify the barriers which impact adversely on life chances so that we can design and deliver high quality services to improve outcomes for children, young people and families. For this reason, an annual funding allocation of £3.5 million pounds has been made to Third Sector groups and organisations working in close partnership to support the work of the Children and Families Service.
- 4.2 The existing funding arrangements have been reviewed regularly but have not been underpinned by an open and transparent commissioning strategy to ensure that the level of funding being allocated is targeted most effectively to meet the identified priorities of the council and to ensure maximum impact. For this reason it is essential that a jointly developed commissioning strategy is developed and implemented in partnership with Third Sector groups so that future funding can be allocated in the most effective way.
- 4.3 The jointly agreed commissioning strategy will have a direct focus on impact and outcomes. The strategy will be developed with the active involvement of Third Sector groups to ensure that future funding distribution will be allocated in an agreed and clearly understood manner. This will maximise the resources at our disposal and increase the quality of partnership working.

- 4.4 The Commissioning Strategy will focus on impact and outcomes and:
  - reflect the stated priorities and aspirations in the Integrated Children's Services Plan and the Single Outcome Agreement;
  - complement and support national and local policy drivers;
  - set out the most effective service provision for children, young people and their families:
  - work with partner agencies and the Third sector to promote a culture of positive health and well being and target the issues associated with mental health; and
  - challenge established practice and identify new ways of working.
- 4.5 The timeline for development will be:

March 2016: Creation of the Commissioning Strategy Group
April – June 2016: Preparation and production of the strategy
July – October 2016: Launch events with partner agencies and Third

Sector

November 2016 – January 2017: Allocation of funding for 2017-18

- The funding allocation for Third Party payments in 2016-17 will reflect a revenue saving of 120k from the overall total of £3.5 million pounds. To minimise the impact on front line services we will work closely with Third Sector partners and continue the ongoing work to reduce overhead costs by making council services and contracts available to individual groups. This will include opportunities to access and share council office facilities to reduce operational costs.
- 4.7 The proposed allocation of funding for 2016-17 and the revenue saving based on the previous allocation will be:
