6 BACKGROUND

6.1 In December 1999 the Accounts Commission for Scotland published a report entitled Understanding our Business which "aims to improve understanding of the importance of management information and corporate management practices to the successful operation of DLO's". The report indicates that Councillors, as committee members, have a responsibility for the supervision and control of DLO's.

This report, along with other reports which are brought forward as necessary, contains information to assist Councillors in undertaking their responsibilities for the City Council's DLO.

- 6.2 This monitoring report provides details to the DSO Committee of the operational performance of the City Council's DLO.
- 6.3 Four Revenue Accounts are summarised in this report:
 - a Property Maintenance
 - b Construction Work below £50,000
 - c Construction Work above £50,000
 - d Ground Maintenance and Other Works

6.4 Monitoring the DLO's budgeted contribution to the General Fund is the subject of a separate joint report by the Chief Executive and Depute Chief Executive (Finance) which is presented to the DSO Committee on a quarterly basis.

7 OPERATIONAL PERFORMANCE FOR THE SIX MONTHS ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2003

7.1 <u>Trading Results</u>

The DLO's performance monitoring report for the six months ended 30 September 2003 is detailed in Appendix 1. The actual turnover for the period is greater than anticipated and shows an increase of some £1,852,224 on the corresponding period of last year. This is due in the main to an increase in turnover on works of maintenance and construction work above £50,000. The department is anticipating that the volume of large contract work will be maintained over the forthcoming months.

The first six months trading results show the surplus at £817,434 compared to £436,823 for the six months ended 30 September 2002. The surplus is better than anticipated for the period under review due to the excellent trading results achieved on maintenance work and large contracts. These results reflect the DLO's commitment to continued improvement and the attainment of Best Value for the City Council's maintenance and construction projects.

The DLO continues to monitor and evaluate performance through monthly meetings of its Business Planning Group and, in accordance with the Department's continuing efforts to improve efficiency, has budgeted for £496,000 expenditure on replacement vehicles and equipment out of the current financial year's surplus.

Based on the six months results and after the purchase of replacement vehicles, plant and equipment the DLO will achieve the £665,000 surplus, being the combined surpluses of £565,000 and £100,000 for Dundee Contracts and Parks DSO respectively, included in the City Council's approved 2003/2004 Revenue Budget.

7.2 Works of Maintenance

The programme of work during the period under review was sufficient to keep the workforce fully employed and it is anticipated that the current level of activity will be maintained throughout the remainder of the financial year.

The Gas and Lift Maintenance service programmes are on target and in addition, during the period April to September 2003 The workforce completed the following day-to-day repairs and planned maintenance work:-

7.3 Construction Work above and below £50,000

The volumes of contract work undertaken during the review period were slightly above the anticipated level of activity. The amount of construction work above £50,000 has risen over the last six months and is expected to remain at current levels over the next few months. This should ensure the workforce is fully employed.

During the period April to the end of September the following contracts were either won in competition or awarded to the DLO:-

7.4 **Grounds Maintenance and Other Works**

The summer maintenance programme has kept the permanent workforce including the normal influx of temporary operatives fully employed during the peak growth season. The winter pruning of shrubs and bedding maintenance has commenced. This work, along with the expected level of landscape contract work, will provide continuity of employment for the permanent workforce throughout the forthcoming winter months.

7.5 **Training**

The DLO's commitment to construction industry training is reflected by the recruitment of a further 10 new apprentices who began training during August 2003. This maintains the DLO's 10% tradesmen/apprenticeship ratio, which greatly surpasses the construction industry norm. Training and development of all employees is recognised by the department's management team as being critical to maintaining the organisation's success.

The department has been recognised for its commitment to training with accreditation to the prestigious Investors in People standard.

7.6 **Summary**

It is anticipated that the level of workforce will be sustained for the remainder of the financial year and that the department will achieve all the objectives set down in its Business Action Plan.
