6 BACKGROUND

- 6.1 Members approved the Draft Planning Policy Advice: Air Quality and Land Use Planning for consultation purposes at the Planning and Transportation Committee meeting of 8 May 2006. Report No. 186/2006 refers. The Director of Planning and Transportation was remitted to report back on any comments received prior to the adoption of the final policy advice.
- 6.2 The six week consultation period extended from 27 October to 1 December 2006. A copy of the Draft Planning Policy Advice was posted out to target groups. In total 154 individuals and groups were consulted including Council Members, community

councils, housing associations, the development and construction industries, neighbouring authorities, quangos and other organisations, the travel and transport industries, major employers, institutions and outside bodies.

6.3 Only one set of comments was received from an outside body, however, this did not require significant alteration of the draft. The Environmental Health and Trading Standards Department have advised that Union Street and Whitehall Street should be added to the list at Box 1 page 2 being areas where measures to reduce contaminants are proposed. It is recommended that Committee approve the Planning Policy Advice including the additions above and refer the document to the Development Quality Committee for consideration with a recommendation that the contents of the Advice are taken on board when determining future planning applications.
