# 1. Purpose of Report

To gain Committee approval to undertake a Feasibility Study to identify options to reconstitute this foreshore route for the Green Circular.

#### 2. Recommendations

- 2.1 That the Committee give approval for a Feasibility Study into the Stannergate walkway to be undertaken.
- 2.2 To approve the offer from the City Engineer's Division to undertake the study for £17,000.

### 3. Financial Implications

The cost of undertaking a Feasibility Study is £17,000. External funding for Study has been agreed in principle from the following contributors who are in agreement with the City Engineer's Division undertaking the work.

#### Contributions

Scottish Enterprise Tayside £5,000 Scottish Natural Heritage £5,000 Paths for All Partnership £4,000

The Leisure & Parks Department's contribution of £3,000 can be met from its Capital Budget for 2001/2002.

### 4. Local Agenda 21 Implications

The route is used extensively by cyclists and walkers both on journeys to work and for recreation. Access to a more sustainable transport network such as these pathways is to be encouraged.

# 5. Equal Opportunity Implications

The provision of routes for walking and cycling offers an affordable and effective form of transport for people without access to a private car. Routes such as these also provide affordable options for exercise.

# 6. Background

- 6.1 The proposal to undertake a Feasibility Study results from the need to ascertain the options for reconstituting the route due to deteriorating conditions of the existing structures and the need to review access arrangements. This will assist the safe passage of cyclists and walkers who commute between Broughty Ferry and the City Centre. This route is also part of the Green Circular Recreational Route, the National Cycle Network, and the North Sea Cycle Route.
- 6.2 It is proposed that this Feasibility Study is undertaken by the City Engineer's Division. This is acceptable to all the external funding parties.
