1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report gives trustees details of the Alexander Torrance Cathro Bequest grant distribution in 2012, together with reports from the various organisations which have applied for 2013.

2 RECOMMENDATIONS

The Trustees are asked to approve the grants as shown in the attached report which amount to £1,000.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

It is anticipated that the income from the above bequest in 2012-13 will only be £80, however there is unallocated revenue funds of £6,062 which will support the grant applications received which give a disbursement of £1,000.

4 BACKGROUND

The Alexander Torrance Cathro Bequest was formed by the residue of an estate handed over to the former Corporation of Dundee in 1948, the free annual income therefrom to be used to give as many children as might have need an opportunity of enjoying an outing in the country or at the seaside.

Following redemption of the Treasury Stock, the Funds are now all invested with the Council's Loans Fund.

1. The Salvation Army	165	215	A letter from the Trust Fund Raiser for Scotland states that the 2012 grant was used to subsidise the cost of sending young people from Dundee to junior camp weeks at Aviemore. It is the group's intention to again treat the children to a Summer Camp at Haggerston Castle in 2013.
2. The Boys' Brigade	110	150	A letter from the Company Section Captain states that last year's grant was used to assist boys from the Dundee Battalion in attending camp at Loch Tay This year the annual camp at Craggan is planned. The grant would be used to meet applications from disadvantaged boys (6/8th Company Lochee) to attend those activities.
3. Sense Scotland	80	0	No application was received this year.
4. One Parent Families Scotland, Dundee Project	85	110	The Project Manager reports that this group works with one parent families who are on low incomes with little resources. The grant was used last year to treat children to an outing at Edinburgh Zoo. A trip to Craigtoun Park is planned for this year.

5. Dundee Women's Aid	80	105	A request has been received from the Administrator for a contribution towards a trip to treat the children affected by domestic abuse cases in Dundee. Last year a summer outing to Broughty Ferry Beach was organised and a similar trip is planned for this year.
6. Dreamz4u	80	105	A Letter has been received from the Trustee in Dundee requesting a donation in order to help with fundraising for children with chronic illness to enjoy a trip to the Sea Life Centre.
7. Sargent Cancer Care for Children	80	105	A request from the Trust Fundraising Manager for a contribution towards the cost of providing respite breaks at a Holiday Home for children suffering from cancer. This is located at Malcolm Sargent House, Prestwick.
8. Fintry Community Playgroup	80	0	No application was received this year.
9. Home Start	80	105	A letter has been received from the Administrator giving details of a planned outing to Monikie Country Park. Home Start works with families in Dundee with at least one child under 5 years old.
10. The Factory Skatepark	80	105	An application has been received to take socially deprived children from Dundee on a trip to Monikie Country Park.
11. Home Link Family Support	80	0	No application was received this year.
