Document Description:

The Dundee Climate Fund aims to involve citizens in developing proposals for and deciding on the allocation of £750,000 which will deliver community-led climate change projects in the city over a four-year period. It is a democratic process built on the principles of Participatory Budgeting whereby citizens decide directly how to spend part of a public budget and supports the delivery of the Dundee Climate Action Plan.

Intended Outcome:

The Dundee Climate Fund is exclusively aimed at constituted Dundee-based groups delivering local climate projects that support the Dundee Climate Action Plan. It also provides a greater opportunity to engage with the public on climate change and sustainability, providing the Council's largest public engagement opportunity since Dundee Decides, and the first on climate change & sustainability. It will enable the Council to engage with the public over an extended period of time and to develop and deliver an associated public engagement plan for the Fund.

How will the proposal be monitored?

An internal governance group will be established to provide effective fund management with representatives from Communities, Sustainability and Climate Change, Dundee Partnership Team, Finance and Legal.

In addition, a Review Panel consisting of experts in energy, transport, waste, resilience and capacity building be established to review project proposals for eligibility, feasibility and deliverability.
