Youth Games Group — Ages 5+



The Yard — Various Ages

This is a centre open to children who have experience of disability. The yard is expanding its provision to include kinship families. This play service is open to the whole family, including siblings and parents/carers. There are a variety of activities for children from assault courses and bikes, sand and water play, to dress-up, crafts and baking. There are workers present to run specific activities with the children, which allows parents/carers to have a chance to grab a coffee and chat with friends, safe in the knowledge the children are having fun in a safe setting. These play sessions run every Sunday from 10:30am-3:30pm, all year round. There will also be additional sessions during the week over the school summer holidays. Advice and Support for Carers

Kinship Care Advice Service for Scotland (KCASS)

KCASS have a YouTube channel that has lots of useful videos on topics that kinship carers may find helpful. These include: managing parental contact; the Children's Hearing System; legal issues; supports in primary and secondary school; welfare benefits; calming methods for use with children; understanding trauma and helping children with this; self-care for kinship carers. Enquire

Enquire is the Scottish advice and information service for children's rights to additional support for learning. This independent agency aims to help children of any age and their parents/carers to understand children's rights to support for learning in schools and nurseries. They can also share practical tips to help families and schools work together and solve problems if they come up. They can also help you find local education and support services or give advice on how to deal with attendance issues or exclusions. NHS Community Listening Service

Many of us find it helpful to talk, especially during stressful events at home or work, or after a bereavement or loss. The Community Listening Service provides 50 minute appointments with fully trained listeners on the phone or face-to-face within your GP practice. These appointments are confidential and available Monday-Friday 9am-5pm, with the first appointment usually being given within a couple of weeks. Teen Ranch Scotland

Teen Ranch is a Christian based youth activity centre. The camp allows young people to experience a variety of different activities such as canoeing, BMX, archery, trampolining, horse riding and more. The camp offers residential stays during school holidays, usually Monday to Friday. The camp, which is based in a Georgian Mansion in the countryside of Perthshire close to Dundee, can accommodate up to sixty-eight campers. Teen Ranch is a suitable environment for young people ranging from 10-17 years old. Children and young people in kinship care may be eligible for subsidised places for teen ranch.
