Welcome to Context Map: Clatto Country Park **Greater Camperdown** Clatto Reservoir Part of the Greater Camperdown network To Bridgefoot & Strathmartine Road Originally created as part of Dundee's public water supply in 1874, the reservoir is no longer connected to the supply network. The deepest point is approximately 8 metres, and the levels are now dependant on rainfall. Camperdown Woods Baldragon The boundaries of the original reservoir park are traced by walls and fences, but the actual explorable paths (many not marked) Red Squirrel extend through areas near by, some of which is being slowly - Sciurus vulaaris returned to forest habitat. These include Clatto Moor to the north, Key: former farmland to the east, and the new 'Admiral Duncan Wood' PRIVATE Entrance / Exit The Green Circular cycle/ walking network connects Clatto to the rest of the city, along with other mapped cycle routes through Information Life Belt An equipped play area can be found on the Western side of the Bus Stop park with items for all ages. SAFETY NOTE: Equipped Play Area Recreational swimming is NOT Natural History: recommended in this reservoir. Toilets (restricted hours) The trees around Clatto are primarily Norway Spruce, along with some Scots Pine, Larch and Lodgepole Pine. The western shelterbelt Parking / Disabled is mainly composed of Sitka Spruce. The woodland on Clatto Moor to Do not attempt to walk on surface ice in winter. the north is mostly Birch. Cycle Routes (including Green Circular) There are many common species of birds in the area, as well as a pair of Mute Swans which breed here every year. The reservoir also attracts a variety of migratory ducks including Pochard and Goldeneye. Year round water-based residents include Mallard and Tufted Ducks. Moorhen, and Coot. A small population of Red Squirrels are still to be found here in the woods; look for the chewed pine cones as evidence. Several types of fish can be found in the reservoir, including perch, pike, roach and bream. Fishing is Catch-and-Release, permitted with bait only.
