Relationships Scotland

Relationships Scotland is a Scotland-wide agency that offers a range of services including: Relationship Counselling; Children and Young People's Counselling; Family Therapy; Family Mediation and Child Contact Centre services. The main aim of a child contact centre is to offer a safe, friendly, neutral, child-centred environment for children to meet their non-resident parent or family member. They are designed to be a stepping stone to a more permanent arrangement for future contact. Contact can take place in a supported or supervised way. You can also use the centres to collect and return the children to the other parent/family member at the start and end of visits. Adults do not have to see or speak to each other at contact centres.
